

Job Posting: Research Coordinator/Associate

Cervical Cancer Screening Services for Inuit Women of Nunavik

A team of researchers from **McGill University** is currently conducting a mixed methods study designed to improve cervical cancer screening access and medical follow-up for Inuit women in Northern Quebec. This project involves a community-based participatory research design. We are working with Inuit communities towards the development of educational and promotional activities for Inuit women and community and health care providers. Together we will be implementing a new screening procedure (Human Papillomavirus self-sampling) and monitoring and evaluating screening-related outcomes.

We are seeking a full time **research coordinator/associate** to contribute to this project.

The successful candidate should have a working knowledge of French and have an MSc or PhD (from an academic discipline such as anthropology, epidemiology, family medicine, nursing, public health, sociology, or social work). Experience with participatory research and Indigenous health research is an asset. They must be familiar with epidemiological and mixed research methodologies, and have experience with qualitative and quantitative analysis. They must be able to work independently. They will be responsible for project coordination as well as data collection, management, analysis and knowledge mobilization.

Inuk scholars are especially encouraged to apply.

Work Location: Lady Davis Research Institute, Jewish General Hospital, Montreal, Quebec, with occasional travel to Nunavik, Quebec.
