Necessary qualifications for the position include evidence of research productivity (peer-reviewed publications) and a strong commitment to excellence in teaching. We invite candidates with strong methodological expertise and research interests in any field of application of public health but particularly in surveillance, intervention research, behavioral economics, non-communicable diseases, maternal and child health, aging, mental health and injury prevention.
