


Performance Benchmarks According to Level of Training



COMMUNICATOR	 Able to set agenda with patient Adapts interview to clinical situation (location, acuity of situation, use of interpreter, etc.) Recognizes and responds to patient cues Uses open and closed-ended questions appropriately Consistently demonstrates empathy and active listening Allows time for appropriate silences Checks with patient to ensure understanding Provides information in a way the patient understands Adjusts communication style as needed (age, education, cognitive abilities, hearing loss, etc) Communicates with families where appropriate Able to handle complex or challenging patient interactions with sensitivity and skill Maintains an appropriate attitude in response to inappropriate/offensive language or comments made by the patient Able to convey benefits, risks and uncertainty Charting is accurate, focused and organized Written communication is accurate, organized and to the point
PROFESSIONAL	 Arrives on time and appropriately dressed for clinical situation Follows up laboratory and other results, responds to messages, and completes letters and other documents in a timely manner. Completes charts in a timely manner; charting is accurate, focused and organized Notifies appropriately in event of absence because of illness or emergency Arranges coverage for practice when away and communicates appropriately when signing over responsibilities Aware of own limitations and asks for help when needed, but does not avoid challenging clinical situations Accepts feedback as constructive and a springboard for further learning Reflects on gaps in his/her medical knowledge and professional practice; if there is a critical incident, the resident is forthcoming and demonstrates self-reflection Shows respect for colleagues, staff, other team members and patients

	 Is honest Aware of and respects confidentiality of patients and colleagues Aware of and respects boundaries of the professional role including applicable Codes of Conduct
COLLABORATOR	 Demonstrates an understanding and respect for the roles of each member of the team Works well in a multidisciplinary environment demonstrating cooperation and respectful communication Considers when referrals are appropriate. Shows a good balance between autonomy and referral Consultation requests include clear reasons for consultation and an effective summary of all relevant clinical information Facilitates handover of care with appropriate information to ensure continuity and patient safety Prepares clear summary notes to assist in effective practice handover at end of residency
HEALTH ADVOCATE	 Consistently takes a patient's social history. Recognizes impact of determinants of health and adapts treatment to the social and personal factors that influence compliance and health outcomes Regularly and appropriately uses the resources in their FMU setting for the benefit of their patients Supports patient and families in accessing community resources and navigating the health care system Consistently applies preventive health screening and health promotion guidelines for both adults and children. Recognizes when the screening guidelines for average risk patients does not apply to their patient. Takes opportunities to incorporate health promotion in patient encounters
SCHOLAR	 Identifies own learning needs and creates a learning plan Identifies knowledge gaps that arise in clinical encounters and able to frame clinical questions that will facilitate search for answers in the medical literature Knows how to access the peer reviewed literature; able to assess a journal article critically Integrates best available evidence into practice

	 Aware of limitations in applying evidence from clinical trials to individual patients; able to use evidence in clinical decision making along with the patient's values and preferences Actively participates in their site's scholarly activities Demonstrates ability to teach junior learners
LEADER	 Able to see 6 - 8 patients per half day with minimal delays Demonstrates flexibility and adapts their schedule to match the needs of their patients when necessary; promotes continuity of care Plans appropriate follow-up of patients Provides comprehensive care Considers effective use of health care resources when planning investigations and treatment Understands basic principles of practice management and billing Able to follow and adapt strategy for maintaining personal wellness Considers the wellness needs of other team members Able to protect time for personal needs without compromising responsibilities Able to prioritize competing professional responsibilities
