## Caring Community: An Innovative Model of Patient and Citizen Partnership in Primary Care

February 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020 15:00-16:00



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Social challenges are often unaddressed in medical care, although their impact on health is significant. Experienced patients and engaged citizens are experts in navigating across the healthcare system and their community, but their role is rarely recognized nor integrated within primary care. Caring Community bridges medical and community care by partnering with experienced patients and engaged citizens working in collaboration with primary care professionals to care for people with complex medical and social needs. This presentation will position the Caring Community model in relation with similar primary care initiatives (eg. peer-support, community navigator, social prescribing), and provide some key learning from testing the model in Montreal over a 3-year period.
