- (2) Provide funding to the CIHR so that it can create academic research grants for studies on gender.
- (3) Create a National Institute for Women's Health Research, that will bring together experts in women's health to tackle gaps in research and care.

Review of Year 1



Kick off Meeting

GOING-FWD's 'kick-off' meeting took place on April 8-9th, 2019 in Montreal, Quebec, Canada.

It was an overwhelming success with an opportunity to bring experts in sex and gender health together to discuss issues related to gender equity and gender mainstreaming across non-communicable chronic diseases (NCDs). A total of seven of GOING-FWD's Principal Investigators, six Canadian Co-Investigators, six International Trainees, and members of the Scientific Advisory Committee attended this 'kick-off' event. Members of the three GOING-FWD Work Packages discussed country and disease-specific gender related factors, clinical and patient related outcome (PRO) variables, data access, research ethic board applications, and personalized approaches to gender medicine. During the meeting, several topics were discussed by experts including data management strategies (e.g., guidelines, documentation, harmonization platforms), data analyses and statistical methods (e.g., machine learning). The relevance of dissemination and knowledge translation strategies were highlighted through the selection of the project logo and the creation of the various dissemination platforms (e.g. Twitter, Facebook and Website).

2nd GOING-FWD Meeting in Austria

Prof. Kautzky-Willer,Co-PI of the GOING-FWD Consortium and President of the <u>International Society of Gender Medicine</u> hosted a meeting for the Consortium Members on September 11th, 2019 the day before the "<u>9th Congress of the IGM</u>" in Austria.

A two day meeting focusing on the importance of gender medicine for individualized precision medicine and patient safety. The main topic of the Congress was "Sex & Gender with focus on personalized medicine and patient safety"




