3.0 For Information

3.1 Presentation on Everspring by Laura Winer, Director of Teaching and Learning Services (TLS) (Appendix A)

At the September 12th CGPS meeting, Council members raised questions and concerns regarding McGill's new online education partner, Everspring. Laura Winer, one of the members of the selection committee, was invited to present to Council. Her presentation provided information on online graduate education and confirmed that McGill sees an opportunity to take a leadership position in this area. Discussions began two years ago at a Deans' Working Group, where the Provost, the Principal and the Deans supported the idea of promoting online education at McGill. Please consult Appendix A for more information.

During the question period, Council members raised the following issues: 1) tuition, 2) access and support to students, 3) distinction on a student's transcript between online education and education on campus. Regarding tuition, the online programs will be self-funded (similar to programs in Management). The initial phase will target graduate certificates, graduate diplomas and non-research masters only. The selection committee will work closely with McGill stakeholders in the process of developing these programs to ensure that all resources are accessible to students. Lastly, it was noted that McGill does not make a distinction between online and on campus education on transcripts. There was no further discussion.

Councilors' Forum

4.0 Item proposed by Nicholas Dunn from the Post-Graduate Students' Society regarding the Graduate Milestones program

Following an item proposed by Mr. Nicholas Dunn, Dean Josephine Nalbantoglu presented the context and history behind the Graduate Milestones Project. In 2013, it was reported that degree completion time for McGill thesis-based graduate students did not reflect the university's academic excellence, and that tracking and monitoring of progress toward degree completion was generally ad-hoc and often poorly communicated with students. Dean Nalbantoglu's predecessor, Martin Kreiswirth, consulted the graduate community who were in favor of developing a central solution for milestone tracking. IT has responded to this need and will deliver a solution that is expected to be launched for Summer 2017 (at the latest September 2017) as a pilot for Master's thesis and Ph.D. programs, and eventually Master's non-thesis programs.

Dean Nalbantoglu explained that the implementation of this central tool will enable the management and tracking of graduate student progress towards major program milestones and degree completion. The benefits include increased student satisfaction, improved ability for supervisors and academic units to manage and track student progress, and improved accessibility to quality data about graduate students for informed decision making. Finally, the new system will eliminate the use of alternative methods (e.g. multiple Excel spreadsheets) to track graduate student progress. Dean Nalbantoglu added that students will now have the opportunity to see their progress, which is not possible with other systems currently in place (such as the GTS tracking tool). There was spirited discussion about the need to impose yet another tool to be mastered by staff in graduate units. Student members of Council were supportive of the need for the Graduate Milestones Project and generally positive about the developments to date. There will be further updates about the project in the spring.

Context behind the initiative

- Faculty representatives attended meetings with all potential vendors
