# 3.0 Major Revision to Program:

# 3.1 M.Sc. Computer Science (Non-Thesis)

# CGPS-MRP-CompSciNT\_R00

Presented by: Prof. Bettina Kemme, from the Faculty of Science

Professor Kemme introduced the major revisions to the existing M. Sc. in Computer Science (non-thesis), which comprise enabling students to apply directly into the non-thesis program and offering them the choice to complete a research project, or an internship, in addition to coursework. Direct entry will help the integration of international students into Canadian settings and labor markets and improve the program's accessibility for students seeking deeper knowledge of computer science. Professor Kemme also presented on the new internship course, which will attract students with interest in advanced industrial positions.

# CGPS Commentary

- A Council member asked about the responsibilities of industries hosting interns and the measures in place
  to ensure quality programming. The proposer confirmed that the internships will be paid and only companies
  with public projects will be eligible. Both companies and students will be required to write reports on the
  progress and quality of the internship.
- A Council member recommended an internship preparation course to help students adapt to workplace culture (GPS already offers modules on "Preparing for your Internship" on myCourses).
- Another Council member inquired whether the proposers will establish criteria to ensure students are ready for the industry. Professor Kemme confirmed that students will be required to complete a minimum number of courses prior to the internship. The company will also provide performance feedback to the unit.
- One Council member asked about the implications of more admissions on resources for current students.
  The proposer noted the School of Computer Science has received government funding to restructure the
  program to include an internship. The Dean also confirmed that this enrolment plan is different than that
  of thesis students.
- A Council member inquired whether students must be bilingual. The proposer said no.





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- Engineering students' roles in securing internships in their co-op program was discussed. The proposer
  explained that for this program, the School of Computer Science wants to oversee internships and will be
  hiring Internship Coordinators.
- Council members asked about student funding and program costs. Dean Nalbantoglu noted the students who do the internship will be paid, which may help contribute to tuition fee payment.
- It was advised that the School consult models of successful internship programs at McGill.

Motion was made by Benoit Gentil, and seconded by Benjamin Forest, to approve the program. The new program was approved with 20 votes (0 abstain, 0 against); it will be reported to SCTP for approval.

#### 5.0 New Models of Academic Program Delivery

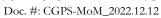
Associate Provost (Teaching and Academic Programs) Chris Buddle presented the mandate of the Working Group on New Models of Academic Program Delivery, which includes recommending strategies and directions for program development at McGill University and reviewing best practices in areas such as learning assessment, experiential learning, and blended learning. Their work seeks to ensure that programs address student demands and resources are used effectively. The Associate Provost shared feedback from the community and elaborated on key points such as the implementation of blended learning, the development of definitions for new types of programs, interest in non-credit offerings, and the possibility of increased summer offerings. Input from Council was requested.

The ensuing discussion addressed topics and questions related to:

- challenges with flexibility in accredited programs
- the necessity to consider impacts of online courses on student loans and fee structures
- challenges related to student engagement in online settings
- the need for consistent and clear student evaluation
- the integration of shorter learning activities (such as those offered by the Library or SCS)
- reconsidering the need for in-person learning for large classes
- the creation of more flexible learning opportunities that also still fit within the McGill framework
- the possibility of reflecting experiential learning opportunities on the student transcript
