Summary- Program Revisions- Master of Science, Applied (M.Sc.A.) Advanced Nursing: (Non-Thesis)- Nursing Services Administration

Following the Senate approval and launch of the Master of Science, Applied (M.Sc.A.) Advanced Nursing: (Non-Thesis)- Nursing Services Administration program, it has not undergone larger-scale revisions, which at this time, are necessary to address:

Current objectives and competencies as mandated by federal and provincial governing organizations, and in accordance with feedback given to us by alumni, current and prospective students, clinical partners, changes in the nursing profession and the healthcare system.

With the opportunity to revise the program, the following measures were taken to conduct a thorough analysis of the program content, as well as opportunities for growth:

- Identification and mapping of competencies according to the Canadian Association of Schools of Nursing (CASN) Educational Framework to each course within each program
- Benchmarking and reviewing content covered in Nurse-Entry (students who are certified nurses entering graduate level studies) Masters programs Quebec and Canadian universities
- Literature review of current topics/content applicable to Nurse-Entry programs Collection of feedback retrieved through the Student-Faculty Communication Task force meetings, as well as course evaluations for all courses in the Master of Science, Applied (M.Sc.A.) Advanced Nursing: (Non-Thesis)- Nursing Services Administration program, as well as feedback from Faculty and clinical partners over recent years.
- Focus groups of current students and alumni
- Input from course coordinators

Review of the feedback resulted in identifying the following opportunities for growth in the programs, and areas to be considered for revision:

- Knowledge Translation content for students in the Research stream
- Clinical application of the role of the Nurse Manager/Leader
- Need for more content in Digital Health and Informatics
- Need for more Health Equity content
- Congruency in course structure to align with different learners needs (e.g. many Nursing graduate courses are taken by students in different Masters programs, with differing specialties, years' experience, etc. and therefore have different needs)
- Challenges in selecting electives to further their Nursing-centered studies
- Adding consistency to course numbering and sections (see NUR2 630, 631 and 632 in course revisions)

Due to the number of needs to address and ongoing regulatory changes in the profession, this submission is the first of two revision submissions- the second to be submitted in the upcoming academic years

Attention to the following is reflected in the revision submission for the M.Sc.(Applied) in Advanced Nursing; Non-Thesis- Nursing Services Administration program:

- Addressing Health Equity competencies in complementary course options
- Aligning with the internship courses in other graduate-level nursing concentrations in structure, and making the internship course within this program mandatory rather than a complementary course.
- Reflecting the same credit weight across all 3 Advanced Nursing programs- with NUR2 629 (4 credits) being replaced by NUR2 624 (3 credits) in the revised curriculum, this program will now be 48 credits instead of 49 credits.
