Revised Program Description
The focus of the MSc(A) Nursing (Non-Thesis) Global Health Direct Entry program is on providing collaborative, trauma-informed, and culturally safe care. A strengths-based nursing and health care approach is used to work with underserved populations in limited resource and rural environments. The program emphasizes health equity focused content. The program includes a semester spent in a Global Health Partnership site (locally, provincially, or internationally) that focuses on clinical and project-based work. The completion of a Qualifying Year (QY) is mandatory before applying to Year 1 of the M.Sc. (Applied) in Nursing; Non-Thesis Global Health Direct Entry Program. Upon completion, graduates are eligible to write the OIIQ licensing exam.

Existing Program Description
The M.Sc.(A.); Nursing (Non-Thesis) - Global Health concentration prepares students for the challenges of working with diverse populations in limited-resource environments, while stressing the importance of understanding the inherent power dynamics, equity issues, and ethical dilemmas that arise through this work. It is based on a belief that we have much to learn from one another. This concentration provides students with global health content throughout their program of study, and students spend one semester taking clinical- and project-based courses in their final year in a global health placement site. This concentration is supported by the Global Health Committee of the Ingram School of Nursing

5.0 Rationale for revised program – explain why revising (cont'd)

The inclusion of a Required Courses credit change for the proposed M.Sc.(Applied) in Nursing; Non-Thesis- Global Health Direct Entry program was added in November 2022 to correct an administrative error from the last instance that this program was revised (2019).

The rationale for the change in credits is as follows, as revisions to the program were based on the following factors:

- **Adoption of the Strengths-Based Nursing philosophy by the Ingram School of Nursing**
- **Changes in regulatory body requirements stipulated by the Quebec Order of Nurses (OIIQ) (e.g. wound care, nursing prescription, developmental assessment, public health, critical care competencies).**
- **Modification in the Canadian Association of Schools of Nursing (CASN) accreditation standards for undergraduate and graduate nurses.**
- **Student learning needs (e.g. request for an increase in nursing skills training hours)**
- **Challenges related to the clinical placements (e.g. access to quality critical care clinical placements).**

A formal program evaluation process included:

- **Extensive environmental scan and gap analysis**
- **Student consultation (Nursing student president, class representatives, VP academic)**
- **Benchmarking McGill nursing programs with other Universities in Quebec, Canada and the United States of America**
- **Broad consultation with clinical partners**
- **Alumni survey**
- **Extensive internal and external expert consultation including site visits to Quebec Nursing schools (e.g. Laval, Montreal) and schools outside Quebec (i.e. McMaster).**
- **Mapping and review of program objectives for relevancy, accountability, and their level of achievements by students (learning outcomes).**

After the aforementioned review and evaluation for revision were completed, it was decided that the following courses would be added to the course of study, for an additional 3 credits to the program:

Course number	Rationale
<u>NUR2 619 Nursing Clinical Skills Laboratory 4 (1 credit)</u>	To address the feedback received via the program evaluation methods, where student learning needs included increased nursing clinical skills training hours, this course was added as a follow-up course to the three Nursing Clinical Skills courses contained in the Qualifying Year (NUR2 517, NUR2 518 and NUR2 519), which is completed prior to entrance in the program.
<u>NUR2 621 Wound Care 2 (2 credits)</u>	To address the changes in regulatory body requirements stipulated by the Quebec Order of Nurses (OIIQ), an additional course focused on wound care, as a follow up to the Qualifying Year wound care course (NUR2 521) was added to the program.

As a result of this formal evaluation process our ISON School Council approved the revision of the M.Sc.(Applied) in Nursing; Non-Thesis- Global Health Direct Entry program.

Additional Notes regarding the Qualifying Year (QY) required for entrance to the M.Sc.(Applied) in Nursing; Non-Thesis- Global Health Direct Entry program:

Along with the changes and additional courses as outlined below, it should be noted that the following revisions were approved in 2019 for the Qualifying Year (year prior to entering Year 1 of the M.Sc.(Applied) in Nursing; Non-Thesis- Global Health Direct Entry program).
