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## 1. MANDATE (APPROVED BY SENATE ON OCTOBER 24, 2001)

The Council of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies reports to Senate through APC, and has a mandate to:

- develop, revise and approve the regulations, guidelines and policies on graduate and postdoctoral studies and so recommend to Senate following consultation with the relevant disciplinary faculties;
- participate in strategic planning for initiatives to promote and enhance graduate and postdoctoral studies;
- review and approve proposals for the creation of new graduate programs.

## 2. COMPOSITION (APPROVED BY APC ON NOVEMBER 18, 2021)

The composition of the CGPS was approved by Senate in October 2001, and was refined during the first years of implementation of the new administrative structure for GPS. Further amendments were subsequently approved by APC (November 16, 2017; November 18, 2021). The current composition is as follows:

- A Postdoctoral fellow
- A Graduate Student from the Faculties of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, Engineering or Science
- A Graduate Student from the Faculties of Arts, Education or Management
- A Graduate Student from the Faculties of Dentistry or Medicine and Health Sciences
- A Graduate Student from the Faculty of Law or the Schulich School of Music
- Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies (GPS) Academic Affairs Officer (voice but no vote)
- Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies (GPS) Academic Affairs Officer (voice but no vote)

#### 4.5 Cotutelle (Joint Thesis Supervision) Agreements

A cotutelle is an agreement of joint supervision at the doctoral level between two cooperating institutions, a Ph.D. student and their co-supervisors. The goal of such an agreement is to enhance student training and experience, and to facilitate collaboration and cooperation between the partner institutions. These agreements give students the benefit of carrying out doctoral research at two different institutions under the guidance of two supervisors with a pre-existing or emerging collaboration.

Ten (10) Cotutelle agreements were signed in 2021-2022.

#### 4.6 Joint and Dual Degree Programs

- **Kyoto-McGill International Collaborative PhD Program in Genomic Medicine**

This Joint degree program started in 2018 in partnership with Kyoto University, an institution that is part of Japan's "Top Global University Project". Cohorts follow a common curriculum in Genomic Medicine approved by the Japanese government. At McGill, the students are based in the Human Genetics PhD program. McGill and Kyoto University jointly select and admit students. Students pursue their programs and spend consecutive terms at both institutions.

Currently, there are twelve (12) students pursuing this Joint PhD degree. In 2021-2022, one student was admitted in the Summer 2022 term. Two (2) students have graduated (Fall 2022 convocation).

- **Dual Master’s and Joint PhD in Public Health Data Science**

McGill University has partnered with University of Bordeaux to offer a Dual Degree in Public Health Data Science (MSc). The program was approved and funded by the French government as part of “écoles universitaires de recherche” in October 2017. At McGill, it is jointly administered by the Department of Epidemiology, Biostatistics, and Occupational Health. Bordeaux’s program focuses heavily on data science, while McGill’s program focuses on foundational courses in epidemiology, biostatistics, and public health. Both programs complement each other’s strengths.

Two (2) students graduated with a Dual Master’s in Summer 2020. The program was on hold during the 2020-2021 academic year due to the pandemic. Three (3) students participated in the program in Fall 2021.

- **Dual Master’s Degree in Neuroscience and Biomedical Engineering**

The University of Electronic Science and Technology of China (UESTC) is a Class A “Double First Class University” with strengths in engineering and computer science whereas McGill is #1 in graduate neuroscience in Canada. Together, the two institutions are able to offer a cooperative program of immersive and integrated international experience at the Master’s level. The program is structured and cohort-based, with the courses delivered in China and a research semester taken at McGill.

The first cohort of 14 students in the dual degree started at UESTC in Fall 2020 and entered the McGill program in Fall 2021. Due to the pandemic, the McGill courses were delivered remotely to students located in China. In the future, it is expected that McGill faculty will travel to China to deliver the courses. All the dual degree students are co-supervised by a McGill professor and a UESTC professor, and they spend a semester at McGill conducting research for their thesis. Three students spent Winter 2022 at McGill, while the remaining 11 students spent Summer 2022 at McGill.

- **Dual Master’s Degree in Law**

The Faculty of Law has partnered with KU Leuven to organize a Dual Degree pathway for students who wish to do the Master of Laws (LLM) Thesis program at McGill and either the Master of Laws (LL.M.) or the Master in de Rechten at KU Leuven. The cohorts will do their first year at either institution, to then spend the second year abroad at the other, completing the second degree. The agreement is signed by both Parties.
