Section A: Minor / Moderate Graduate Program Revisions

Faculty of Medicine:

M.Sc. Family Medicine (Thesis): Medical Education (45 credits)

Addition of course FMED 616 – Applied Literature Reviews (1 credit) to the required course section and removing one credit from the elective course section.

M.Sc. A. OT. Occupational Therapy (Non-Thesis) (60 credits)

Increasing credit weight of two required courses: OCC1 620 – Work/Ergonomics (3 credits) and POTH 612 – Advanced Research Methods (4 credits).

M.Sc. A. PT. Physical Therapy (Non-Thesis) (60 credits)

Increasing credit weight of two required courses: PHTH 623 – Differential Diagnosis and Management (4 credits) and POTH 612 – Advanced Research Methods (4 credits).

Ph.D. Epidemiology (0 credits)

In the required course section: removing course EPIB 610 – Advanced Methods: Causal Inference (3 credits) and adding a new course EPIB 606 – Principles of Study Design (2 credits). Increasing the credit weight and revising the course titles of two courses [EPIB 604 – Doctoral Level Epidemiologic Methods 1 (4 credits) and EPIB 608 – Doctoral Level Epidemiologic Methods 2 (4 credits)]. Revising course title of EPIB 609 – Doctoral Seminar in Epidemiology (3 credits). In the complementary section, removing the 3 credits in ethics.

Ph.D. Epidemiology: Global Health (0 credits)

In the required course section: removing course EPIB 610 – Advanced Methods: Causal Inference (3 credits) and adding a new course EPIB 606 – Principles of Study Design (2 credits). Increasing the credit weight and revising the course titles of two courses [EPIB 604 – Doctoral Level Epidemiologic Methods 1 (4 credits) and EPIB 608 – Doctoral Level Epidemiologic Methods 2 (4 credits)]. Revising course title of EPIB 609 – Doctoral Seminar in Epidemiology (3 credits). In the complementary section, removing the 3 credits in ethics.

Ph.D. Epidemiology: Pharmacoepidemiology (0 credits)

In the required course section: removing two courses [EPIB 610 – Advanced Methods: Causal Inference (3 credits) and EPIB 631 – Pharmacoepidemiology 2 (2 credits)] and adding a new course EPIB 606 – Principles of Study Design (2 credits). Increasing the credit weight and revising the course titles of two courses [EPIB 604 – Doctoral Level Epidemiologic Methods 1 (4 credits) and EPIB 608 – Doctoral Level Epidemiologic Methods 2 (4 credits)]. Revising course title of EPIB 609 – Doctoral Seminar in Epidemiology (3 credits). In the complementary section, removing the 3 credits in ethics.
