Rationale for Program Proposal**M.Ed. in Educational Psychology; Non-Thesis – General Educational Psychology Project**

With 36 credits of required and research project courses, 12 credits of complementary courses, and updating the content and titles of many courses, the proposal seeks to achieve the following objectives:

- 1) Students will graduate with a solid base of knowledge in educational psychology and the skills to implement these teachings in the classroom and administration.
- 2) With a stronger foundation of the key areas of educational psychology, more challenging and practical experiences will be possible for senior students.
- 3) Students will be able to foster a greater sense of community through increased shared courses and access to faculty members and staff.
- 4) The Department will be able to reduce its overall course offerings, more easily predict enrollments, and ensure adequate and efficient class sizes.
- 5) By removing over 30% of complementary courses available to students, a strong and varied list of courses remain, ensuring students retain the ability to customize their degree within defined boundaries (to note: this list is pulled from existing required courses in other concentrations and degrees, so enrollments are predictable).
- 6) The program will now be on the cutting edge of developments (in research, teaching, and related areas) in the field.
- 7) By proposing a research project program of 48 credits of duration, students will be eligible to receive and maintain major fellowships over 4 full-time semesters by retaining a full-time enrollment status.
- 8) Additionally, graduates will have completed 2 years of full-time study, making teachers eligible for salary increases tied to full years of higher education completed.
- 9) With the increased research requirements, this program would serve as a ground for future doctoral student recruitment.

8.0 Program Description (Maximum 150 words)

The MEd in Educational Psychology (Non-Thesis) - General Educational Psychology: Project provides students the flexibility to design a program that satisfies their professional and academic needs. The program provides a foundation in core areas of educational psychology (inclusive education, learning sciences) through core courses on learning theories, motivation, human development, and diverse classroom populations, complemented by research skill development. The role of schools and communities is also examined. Graduates will have the skills to understand and contribute to the growth and enhancement of knowledge and practice in educational psychology and develop tools for implementing new teaching models in the classroom. The program also provides opportunities to study one area in greater depth or to add diverse course experiences, and complete a Research Project.

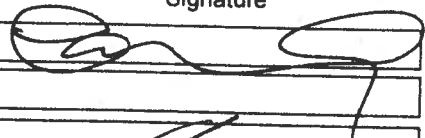
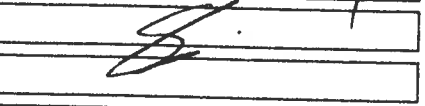
