The committee established that there was a clear need for a 'formal' mechanism to 'socialize' students within the department into the discipline (e.g., how to publish). This revision reflects the addition of a required, year-long Professional Development Seminar in Sociology for all incoming graduate students to address this programmatic 'gap.'</p> <p>GPS has requested that we reduce our MA thesis programs to conform to Quebec higher education mandates that require them to total 45 credits.
