| Image: Second system Image: Second system Image: Second | A few years ago, the Department felt the need to create a course sequence (ANTH. 602 and ANTH. 603) common to the majority of our incoming students. This sequence, focused on Theory, would help create a common theoretical base amongst our students and also build a sense of belonging to a cohort. In order to keep the requirements equal, however, we considered that these two courses should replace one of the three Tutorial courses that were the sole requirements in the previous program. We also need to maintain the possibility for students to fulfill the requirements via only Tutorials because the Department of Anthropology also has Archaeology and Bioanthropology students that may need other basic courses. In addition, students that join the PhD program from our own MA program may have already taken 602 and 603 and consequently will have to also use the three Tutorial path. These changes, thus, are intended to reflect current existing practice in the PhD program of using 2 theory courses to replace 1 tutorial essay. The potential list of additional/non-mandatory courses is so high (12) because some of our students, in addition to content based courses, require foreign language training, which might entail several years of intensive courses. | |

Language Requirement

A language examination, normally French, must be passed before an oral examination of the research proposal may be scheduled. Francophone students can satisfy the language requirement by demonstrating competency in English. The purpose of the language requirement is to ensure that the student has access to anthropological literature in at least two languages. Under special circumstances, a language other than English or French may be substituted, provided that there is sufficient anthropological literature on the student's research topic in that language.
