# Timeline

- **April 2024** – Launch of program by Banting, information appears on GPS website, units informed and notified of any changes
- **Now until to June 7, 2024** – Faculties solicit and identify nominees
- **June 7, 2024** – Deadline for Faculty selection of nominees, submission of form for set up of Graphos writing workshops and eligibility check by GPS
- **June 19, 2014** – Banting Crafting your application workshop for PDFs - GPS
- **July 9, 2024** – Banting Supervisor letter workshop - GPS
- **July and August** - GRAPHOS offers writing workshops, applicant and supervisor meet with expert and non-expert reviewers, applicant revises documents in consequence.
- **September 2024** – Submission of complete application to GPS for final vetting, nominees entered in FAD – early September
- **September 2024**- Letter of Endorsement to successful nominees provided by GPS: **September XX, 2024**
- **FINAL SUBMISSION** - Nominee submission on ResearchNet deadline: **September XX, 2024 at 20:00 EDT**

# Program Overview

The Banting Postdoctoral Fellowships are intended to fund the very best postdoctoral applicants, both nationally and internationally, who will positively contribute to the country's economic, social and research-based growth.

- 2-year awards, \$70,000/year
- **70 fellowships** are awarded annually. Fellowships are distributed equally among CIHR, NSERC and SSHRC
- **~500-700 applications / year submitted – [you do the math]**

•Banting PDF program aims to:

- Attract and retain top-tier PDF talent
- Position them for success as research leaders of tomorrow
- Develop their leadership skills

# Eligibility Requirements

- Canadian citizens
- permanent residents of Canada
- foreign citizens
- Eligibility window for degree completion (submission of final thesis)

Applicants must have fulfilled all degree requirements for a PhD, PhD-equivalent or health professional degree within the prescribed eligibility window – **September 15, 2021 and September 30, 2025** (inclusive) i.e., **before** the start date of their award.

Applicants who have not fulfilled all requirements for their degree at the time of application must submit proof **no later than October 15, 2025**.

The window of eligibility could be extended by a cumulative **maximum of three years** if the applicant had their career interrupted for extenuating circumstances. It will only be extended by the duration of the eligible delay(s)/interruption(s).

# Evaluation Criteria

## Research excellence and leadership in the research domain

- ✓ Track record to date as demonstrated by the quality of the applicants' research contribution (research history)
- ✓ Sphere of influence achieved to date by the applicant (impact of their activities)

## Quality of applicant's proposed research proposal

- ✓ Promise and quality of the research proposal (feasibility, timelines, novelty of the research)
- ✓ Proposed institutional environment
- ✓ Career aspirations of the applicant and the potential to make a significant impact (rationale **for why the applicant is working with the proposed supervisor at the proposed institution.**)

## Institutional commitment and **demonstrated synergy between applicant and institutional strategic priorities** – examined in terms of:

- ✓ demonstrated commitment of the institution to support the development of the applicant's research and leadership capacity (funding, facilities, equipment, etc.) and professional development
- ✓ demonstrated research capacity in the area of the applicant's proposed research, enabling the institution to provide an intellectually stimulating environment and position the candidate as a research leader
- ✓ demonstrated alignment and synergy between the applicant's research ambitions and the institution's potential to benefit strategically from its engagement with the applicant (alignment with [McGill Strategic Research Plan](#) priorities).

# How are these different from other fellowships?

- Emphasis is on the synergy between the applicant, supervisor and the institution
  - All must demonstrate commitment to the proposed research program and the research environment.
  - Applicant must demonstrate why this supervisor and this research environment is the very best place to carry out their research and vice versa.
- International applicants are eligible
- Emphasis on research leadership

# What does a Banting Fellow look like?

- A future leader in their discipline
- A future societal leader
- An excellent communicator
- An innovator and groundbreaker in their field
- Someone who seeks the maximum impact for their work

# Selection Criteria (33%)

## 1. Research excellence and leadership in the research domain

- **Research excellence** based on track record and defined by quality of applicant's research contribution
- **Leadership in research** domain defined by the sphere of influence achieved to date by the applicant.
- Stage and career path are considered
- Applicant's role in research contributions important and needs to be stated
- Impact of previous research contributions important and needs to be stated



# Selection Criteria (33%)

## 2. Quality of applicant's proposed research program

- the promise and quality of the proposal;
  - SGBA+ considerations
  - Indigenous Research – community engagement
- **the environment(s)** in which the proposed research will be conducted; and
- the aspirations of the applicant (impactful, research-intensive career).

# Selection Criteria (33%)

## 3. Commitment and demonstrated synergy between applicant, supervisor and institutional strategic priorities in all sections of the proposal

- Demonstrated **commitment to support development** of the applicant's research and leadership capacity through:
  - **support** (e.g., funding, facilities, equipment, mentorship, environment, etc.)
  - **professional development** (in general and specific to this PDF)
- Demonstrated **institutional research capacity** in the applicant's research area
- Demonstrated **alignment and synergy** between:
  - Applicant's research ambitions and the institution's potential to benefit strategically from engagement with the applicant
  - Alignment with institution's strategic priorities

# Elements of a Banting Application

- Application (completed on ResearchNet)
- Canadian Common CV (CCV)
- 3 referees - referee contact information required in the application; they will complete their assessments online for the applicant according to the 3 evaluation criteria
- Fulfillment of degree requirements form (must be signed by the institution that conferred the PhD degree, PhD-equivalent or health professional degree)
- Significance of research contribution (describe **top 3**, 1 page)
- Significance of leadership contribution (describe **top 3**, 1 page)
- Research Proposal (4 pages)
- Bibliography (max 4 pages)
- Supervisor's statement (4 pages) (guidelines on Banting and GPS webpage)

# Faculty Role & Responsibilities

- Inform GPS ([graduatefunding.gps@mcgill.ca](mailto:graduatefunding.gps@mcgill.ca)) of your deadline and name of the principle contact person
- Inform supervisors of Faculty selection process and Faculty deadlines
- Provide supervisors with PowerPoint presentation on “Banting Supervisor Statement” and “Banting Guidelines for Supervisor’s Statement (both posted on GPS webpage <https://www.mcgill.ca/gps/funding/fac-staff/awards/banting-postdoctoral-fellowships> under tools and resources).
- Recruit selection committee members for faculty selection and circulate applications to faculty-internal review committee for adjudication – prioritize comments not just ranking – rankings do not help the applicant to make a better application to the funding agency
- Submit **nominee names** to GPS via **MS form on or before June 7, 2024**. [Banting 2024 Nominee form](#)
- Facilitate expert and non-expert reviewer face-to-face or zoom meetings with applicant and supervisor in July/August.
- Ensure final application is complete, PDF remains eligible, supervisor letter is on point and covers **all** criterion.
- Submit **final** applications and reviewer comments to [gradcomp.gps@mcgill.ca](mailto:gradcomp.gps@mcgill.ca) and enter FAD data for **ALL** applicants – including gender – by **September 4, 2024** (If login information is required contact GPS)

# Face-to-face review

- Expert and non-expert reviewers identified by supervisor/applicant
- Face-to-face or zoom meetings to discuss all aspects of the application by **reviewers, applicants and supervisor during July/August** - dates and times for the meeting arranged by applicant
- Applicant and supervisor revise application based on reviewer comments
- Full revised application along with reviewer comments submitted to GPS September 4, 2024
- GPS to review applications

# Role & Responsibilities of Nominee Supervisor

- Solicit/respond to eligible prospective applicant(s) and agree to sponsor the application (see Program description for eligibility).
- Assist the applicant in completing the application, particularly the research proposal, and provide editorial input for the entire application.
- Prepare the Supervisor's Statement (4 pages max); Please consult Banting Application Guide for details [http://banting.fellowships-bourses.gc.ca/en/app-dem\\_guide.html](http://banting.fellowships-bourses.gc.ca/en/app-dem_guide.html)
- Review all documentation provided by Faculty paying attention to the process and deadlines.
- All applications must go through the internal procedures specified by the respective Faculty.
- GPS does not accept applications forwarded by applicants / supervisors without Faculty-level review OR without face-to-face meeting.

# Role & Responsibilities GPS

- Hold info session for faculty contact and provide resources for supervisors, evaluation criteria, etc.
- Hold info session for applicants.
- Send list of nominees to GRAPHOS (nominees will be contacted by GRAPHOS with invitation to attend workshops/peer review, ~ 40 applicants can be accommodated).
- **Review applications for completeness and eligibility, etc. (mid-September).**
- Provide Institutional Letter to nominees ~2 days before the application submission deadline.



# Tips for Applicant Success

- Applicants must polish and revise the application (repeat), tailor it to a wide audience (pay attention to the review panel membership)

- Pay attention to criterion
- Show how project is original, innovative, feasible
  - Convey timeliness of opportunity
  - Avoid jargon and acronyms in the proposal - the committee will include scholars outside their area.
- Aim to demonstrate why they are:
  - The right person
  - With the right project
  - Working with the right research group
  - In the right place to develop a world-leading outcome
