

Competition Timeline





CGS D – Program Overview

Competition: One national competition

Value: \$35,000 per year

Duration: 36 months

Tenure: Canadian institutions only

Meritorious CGS-D applicants may also be eligible **for agency-specific doctoral awards**. **Note:** NSERC and SSHRC have their own **doctoral award** and you should refer to the appropriate literature for further details.



Agency Specific Awards

SSHRC Doctoral Award: \$20,000 - Duration Varies (12, 24, 36 or 48 months)

SSHRC determines the value and duration of an award based on the number of months of full-time study the applicant will have completed by December 31 of the calendar year of application to a maximum of 48 months

Graduate Funding

NSERC Postgraduate Award (PGSD): \$21,000 – Duration 36 monts

CIHR: Doctoral Foreign Study Award (DFSA): \$35,000 – Duration 36 months

Tenure: May be held abroad



CGS D – Special initiatives

Indigenous student researchers

 Institutions may recommend applications from self-identified Indigenous student researchers to the doctoral awards competition beyond their application quota. Selfidentified Indigenous student researchers must agree to their personal information being used for this purpose by making the appropriate selection in the application form.

Black student researchers (NSERC & SSHRC)

- The Government of Canada has deployed additional funds to increase direct support for Black student researchers. CGS D applicants who self-identify as Black and provide consent to be considered for funds targeted towards specific groups may be selected to receive this funding. Each agency has a limited number of additional CGS D awards reserved for this initiative.

Open to Canadian citizens, permanent residents and those with <u>Protected Person Status</u>



Submit **only one doctoral award** application in a given academic year. Nominations to the Vanier CGS program do not count towards this limit


Program of Study Eligibility







Indicators:

- Quality of research proposal
 - specific, focused and feasible research question(s) and objective(s)
 - clear description of the proposed methodology
 - significance and expected contributions to research
- Relevant training, such as academic training, lived experience and traditional teachings
- Research experience and achievements relative to the applicant's stage of study, lived experience and knowledge systems
- Quality of contributions and extent to which they advance the field of research. Contributions may include: publications, patents, reports, posters, abstracts, monographs, presentations, creative outputs, knowledge translation outputs, community products, etc.
- Demonstration of sound judgment and ability to think critically
- Demonstration of responsible and ethical research conduct, including honest and thoughtful inquiry, rigorous analysis, commitment to safety and to the dissemination of research results and adherence to the use of professional standards
- Enthusiasm for research, originality, initiative, autonomy, relevant community involvement and outreach
- The ability or potential to communicate theoretical, technical and/or scientific concepts clearly and logically in written and oral formats



Selection Criteria

Relevant experience and achievements obtained with and beyond academia 50%

Indicators:

- Scholarships, awards and distinctions (amount, duration and prestige)

- Request all university <u>official</u> transcripts (whether program completed or not; including <u>Fall 2023</u> transcripts) and upload to application
- Contact Referees. Provide them with: a deadline BEFORE your own, your CV, Proposal, Contributions, and Selection Criteria.
