We are writing to provide an update on the process that is underway related to the student aspect of how McGill will employ Indigenous citizenship verification. We wrote to you in March 2023 to inform you of this work and to invite students who presently self-identify as Indigenous to participate in a working group. We currently have formed the working group, which commenced its work on June 1st, 2023. This initiative is grounded in McGill's commitment to Truth and Reconciliation as articulated in the 52 Calls to Action.

The composition of this working group is as follows:

- 1) Associate Director Indigenous Student Success (Co-Chair)- Thomasina Phillips
- 2) Associate Provost of Indigenous Initiatives (Co-Chair)- Celeste Pedri-Spade
- 3) One (1) internal Indigenous staff member- Avery Barnaby
- 4) Two (2) Indigenous community representatives- Kevin Kanahsohon Deer and Lynn Jacobs
- 5) Four (4) Indigenous McGill University student representatives- Angel Oliver, Taylor Goodleaf, Jenni Makahnouk, and Sage Goodleaf-Labelle

This Indigenous-led process will be grounded in the principles of transparency, respect, accountability, kindness, and inclusivity.
