



News from Immigration Canada

- January 22, 2024 Immigration Canada (IRCC) announced that the Government of Canada has set an intake cap on international study permit applications for a period of two years.
 - Who at McGill will be affected by the cap? Newly admitted undergraduate students
 - Graduate students will **not** be affected by the cap.
- February 15, 2024 Effective immediately, international students who complete a Master's program that is less than two years in length are now eligible for a 3 year Post-graduation Work Permit.

What immigration documents do I need?



*US Citizens and US permanent residents are exempt from both Entry Visa/TRV and eTA

You should NOT make travel plans until you have received your CAQ, Letter of Introduction and your TRV or eTA.

 - Start of program?
 - August 28, 2024 (or earlier if specified by program)
 - Duration of program?
 - PhD degree: Maximum 4 years
 - Masters Degree: Maximum 2 years
 - Master's Non-Thesis: Indicate official length of program
- B. Create your profile on Arrima Use the application number found in the Immigration Quebec online portal
- C. Pay the application fee (\$128) through Arrima
- D. Return to the Immigration Quebec online portal to access your Personalized Document Checklist

E. Upload and submit your required documents on Arrima

- Proof of **financial capacity** may be required
- Handwritten signatures required for forms (electronic or iPad signatures are not accepted)
- After uploading all documents, you must submit them by clicking "Déposer" in order to complete the CAQ application.



F. Receive confirmation online and download your CAQ!

- You can check the status of your application on the Immigration Quebec portal. Once your CAQ is approved, you will receive the CAQ on the Immigration Quebec portal.
- Approximate processing time: 5 weeks (after supporting) documents are received)


Who Needs to Prove Financial Capacity?

- Students currently living in Austria, Canada, U.S., France (including La Réunion), Greenland, Hong Kong, Mexico, Monaco, or Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon must also include recent proof that they can pay for <u>tuition and related fees</u>, <u>living expenses</u> and travel costs for their FIRST YEAR OF STUDIES.
- Living expenses are approximately \$15,078 per year for a single student
- Documents that can demonstrate financial capacity:
 - 3 most recent bank statements
 - Recent bank letter indicating balance in account(s)
 - Proof of financial aid, scholarship, award, bursary
 - Proof of departmental funding
 - If you will be paying reduced tuition (e.g. Quebec rate of tuition), this should be clearly stated.
- If someone else is funding your studies (e.g. parent), they must sign and date a <u>Declaration</u> of financial support form
- (OPTIONAL) A cover letter explaining the costs of your first year of studies and how you will be paying these costs

Step 3: Once your CAQ has been approved, apply for your **study permit.** Your CAQ will be issued to you in your Immigration Quebec portal >> save this!

- Register for an online IRCC account (either <u>IRCC secure account or IRCC portal</u>)
- If using IRCC secure account:
 - Answer "Check your eligibility" questionnaire
 - Fill out PDF form(s) provided
- Scan and upload documents on checklist and pay fees
- Once your application is approved you will receive a <u>Port of Entry (POE) Letter of Introduction</u> *If necessary, you will be prompted to mail your passport to the Visa Office in order to obtain your TRV.

Your account lets you start an application, submit and pay for your application, get messages related to your application, check the status of your application and update your information.

If you're applying to **extend** your study permit, **you must use the IRCC secure account.**<u>Extend your permit in the IRCC secure account.</u>


- If using the IRCC secure account complete and validate the "Application for a Study Permit Made Outside of Canada (IMM 1294)" PDF form (included in the "Document Checklist").
- Collect all of the supporting documents listed on your personalized "Document Checklist".
- Check the <u>Visa Office Instructions Guide</u> for your region to see if there are any other required documents for you to submit that may not appear in your "Document Checklist".
- If additional documents are required that do not appear on your "Document Checklist", merge them into one file and upload under the Optional Documents Client Information section of your online account.

STUDENT DIRECT STREAM (SDS)

IMPORTANT! Certain visa offices outside of Canada may require students to provide **proof that they have paid the tuition fees for the first year of their studies** (*e.g.* some students from China and India, and students applying through the **Student Direct Stream**). See our <u>Study Permit Application Guide</u> for more information.

- All applicants must include **proof of financial capacity** for one years tuition and fees, travel costs and annual living expenses.
- Valid credit card needed (\$150 CAD + 85\$ biometrics)
- Medical exam may be required
 - If you have lived in a <u>designated country</u> for 6 months or longer in the past year; OR
 - If your program* requires you to work in an occupation that brings you into close contact with children, the elderly and other vulnerable populations – even if your Document Checklist does not include a medical exam.
- If your program requires an internship/Co-Op, apply for your Co-op
 <u>Work Permit</u> in the same application. Depending on your program or
 where you live, you may need to complete an upfront medical exam
 (see above).
- Entry Visa/TRV or eTA will be issued automatically if needed



Additional requirements

- Certain applicants may need a medical exam.
 - **NOTE:** If a medical exam is required with your application, you must bring a copy of your valid eMedical receipt with you when you travel.
- You may be asked to submit biometric information. Fee of \$85
 - NOTE: Immigration Canada has expanded their <u>biometric program</u>, which now affects most students. Please see <u>Immigration Canada's website</u> for more information.
- Citizens of certain countries will automatically receive an Entry Visa/TRV*, if you're applying from outside of Canada
- If you do not require a TRV, you will automatically receive an **Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA)*** linked to your passport

If you're coming as a visitor (for a 1-term exchange), you will need to apply separately for a TRV or an eTA*


Documents you must bring with you to get your study permit:

- · a valid passport or travel document.
 - Your study permit won't be valid beyond your passport's expiry date.
- a valid temporary resident (visitor) visa (TRV) or Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA), if required.
 - o Your eTA is valid for multiple visits to Canada, until ... Your eTA number is and is linked to the passport you used when you applied to study in Canada. If you obtain a new passport before you will need to apply for a new eTA by visiting www.canada.ca/eTA.

Info about Biometrics

Once your CAQ has been approved, you can apply for your study permit at your **Port of Entry** (e.g. land border or airport)

Bring with you:

- your valid passport
- your CAQ
- your Letter of Admission from McGill (from Slate)
- a photocopy of your proof of financial capacity
- the processing fee of \$150 CAD (U.S. or CAD cash, credit & debit card accepted)
- U.S. Permanent Residents (Green Card Holders) may have to provide their biometrics and pay a fee of \$85


Why we need your legal documents

All universities in Quebec must report their students' legal status in Canada to the Quebec Ministry of Education.

 If you are <u>International</u>, you must have immigration permission to remain in Canada for the length of your registration at McGill, according to the level of your program (e.g. undergraduate, graduate, postdoctoral, etc).

Once you receive your documents, you **must** submit scanned copies <u>via webform</u> to McGill Legal Documents.

IMPORTANT! You should NOT make travel plans until you have received your CAQ, Letter of Introduction and your TRV or eTA.




Quebec Permanent Code

- All students who attend an educational institution in Quebec must have a Quebec Permanent Code
- A Quebec Permanent Code is a government ID number created and assigned to you by the Quebec Ministry of Education
- You do not have to take any steps to obtain a Quebec Permanent Code
- This code is generated for you once McGill receives your legal documents
- For more information contact <u>Service</u> <u>Point</u> (scan QR code)

Bringing a Spouse and/or Dependent Children

Your spouse or common-law partner can apply to accompany you to Canada:

- a) as a Visitor, OR
- b) as a Worker, by applying for an Open Work Permit (OWP) as an accompanying spouse



Children

- 5 years old or less (going to daycare/kindergarten): can come as Visitors
- Of school age: should come as Students (must have a CAQ and Study Permit)

Bringing a Spouse and/or Dependent Children

Tips:

- We recommend that you apply for your dependents' documents at the same time when applying for your immigration documents. You must use the IRCC secure account (not the IRCC portal) if you intend to apply together!
- We recommend that families travel and enter Canada together

- You can also join the McGill Parents' Network via MS Teams.

Health Insurance

All international students are automatically provided with McGill's health insurance (IHI) plan once registered.

You do not need to provide proof of health insurance when applying for your immigration documents.



Traveling to Canada

- Even if your immigration documents are issued to you in the summer, we do not recommend that you travel to Canada more than 4-6 weeks before the start of your program.
- If you must travel, be prepared to explain your situation at the border
