Why Contact the ISA Office?

Student Affairs:

- Mandatory co-op work permit for international students (B.Ed & B.A). Contact ISA office to get a letter for the permit.
- Academic standing
- LOA and/or part-time status
- Supplemental/deferred exams
- Late course add/withdrawal
- Ministry of Ed. teaching certification (how to apply)

Faculty of Education Regulations

Course Load

- Students must be registered full-time (minimum of twelve (12) credits per term)
 - Part-time status may be possible, but requires special permission (prior to the end of the Add/Drop period)
- The "normal" course load per term is 15 credits.
- Students in Satisfactory Standing (CGPA 2.00 or greater) may take up to 17 credits per term.
 - Students who need to take more than 17 credits in one term must request a credit overload
- Students must complete 27 credits in the Fall and Winter terms to be eligible for in-course scholarships and awards.

Faculty of Education Regulations

Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) Option

- Permitted for:
 - One elective course per term
 - To a maximum of 10% of your credits taken at McGill to fulfill the degree requirements
- You can add the S/U grading option on Minerva until the end of the course change period (Add/Drop deadline). You may remove the S/U grading option until the "Withdrawal without refund" deadline. No further changes to the grading mode can be made after these deadlines.
- Not permitted for:
 - Required or complementary courses, including subject area courses for B.Ed. students.

Faculty of Education Regulations

Time Limit

- Students are expected to complete their program in no more than:
 - five (5) years after their initial registration and within 150 credits for the B.Ed. degree;
 - four (4) years after their initial registration and within 120 credits for the B.Sc.(Kinesiology) degree & B.A. Education (Education in Global Contexts).
- Students who enter into a Freshman year become subject to these regulations one year *after* their initial registration.
- Students who exceed these limits must apply to the Faculty for permission to continue their studies.

Pédagogie de l'Immersion Française (PIF)

PIF is an option embedded in the **K/Elem** program designed to prepare pre-service teachers to teach in **French Immersion** programs.

- "French immersion" = Teaching/learning French as a second language through subject/content areas
- No additional credits required French and French Immersion pedagogy course are embedded in the regular K/Elem program
- Should increase your potential for employability
- French immersion is the norm in English schools in Quebec, and is popular across Canada



BEING A McGILL STUDENT

Transition to University

The transition to university is a big one and you need to be an **active agent** in your academic and personal success, such as by:

- Connecting with your Academic Advisor at least once per term
- Familiarizing yourself with the Faculty's spaces and services
 (ISA Office, cafeteria, EdUS/SAPEK/MEdUSA, Career Services, etc.)
- Asking questions and seeking help early
- Attending events and workshops offered through the University, Faculty, and student societies
- Finding out about support services offered at McGill, including Peer Support, Wellness Hub, Scholarships and Student Aid, etc.

Do your research

McGill is a **decentralized** University, meaning Faculties and programs do NOT all operate in the same way.

Be careful about tips/info you hear from peers or alumni: information may have changed or is not the same for Education.

It's always best to check:

- Education website (ISA, DISE, KPE)
- Faculty of Education staff (e.g. Academic Advisor, ISA Office)
- 2023-24 e-Calendar



Pay your tuition and fees

- View your eBill on Minerva
- Can provide Guest Access to other individuals who will pay your fees
 - Only gives access to e-Bills, tax receipts, e-Payment!
- August fee payment deadline = August 31!

Check and use your McGill email

- Variation of firstname.lastname@mail.mcgill.ca
- Official means of communication between you and the University
- Tip: You can <u>change your email settings</u> so that emails from your McGill email account are automatically forwarded to your personal email account
 - Take note, though, that although you can receive McGill emails at your personal account, McGill instructors and staff will only respond to emails sent from your McGill account
- McGill email = McGill username.
 - Used to sign into all of McGill's portals, including myMcGill, myCourses, myFuture, and Minerva.
 - Also used to sign into campus WiFi and to use on-campus printing services (uPrint) when back on campus.

Go international

Exchange, Study Away and distance internship opportunities are great ways to enhance your experience here at McGill; but remember:

- Plan ahead with your Academic Advisor; most programs are highly prescribed and there are limited terms for Exchange
- Minimum CGPA of 3.00 required for most opportunities
- Minimum of 12 McGill graded credits completed at time of application
- B.Ed. students cannot go on Exchange during Field Experience terms (but can do a distance placement for FE4)

Buddy System

The Buddy program pairs new Schulich students with current students who provide a friendly face, helping hand, and first Montreal friendship that can make a world of difference for new arrivals. Buddies can also offer linguistic support, cultural guidance, and information about life at Schulich.




With this Library app



Field Experiences (FEs)


- **4 FEs** (1 per year ... exceptions exist)
- Progression in workload, Professional Competency acquisition...
- Through partnership between ISA/Placement Coordinator, CT (Cooperating Teacher), Supervisor, School Admin, (School Board)
- 1st Field Experience (FE1)
 - Sec (ELA & Soc. Sci.), K/Elem, TESL
 - November 13 November 30
 - Sec (Math & Sci), Music, PHYS Ed
 - April 22 May 3
 - Phys. Ed.
 - April 29 May 17

Field Experience Timing (as of now)

- FE1 Fall or Spring
- FE2 Spring (April-May)
- FE3 Fall (DISE students start before Fall term begins!)
- FE4 Winter

Field Experiences are only done "off-cycle" (e.g. not in the above terms) on exceptional, case-by-case bases

Placement Process



What can you do now

- Make sure you have registered for EDFE 200/209 (Secondary, K/Elem, TESL) if doing FE1 in Fall 2023 term
- Update your mailing address and phone number on Minerva
- Review the Student Teaching section of the ISA website (placement process, dates, e-Handbook, policies, forms...): www.mcgill.ca/isa/teaching
- Stay tuned for an email from ISA about the placement form opening
- Get in touch with the Student Accessibility & Achievement Office, if you believe you may need accommodations in the field

Note: Students are <u>not permitted to contact teachers or schools themselves</u> to make arrangements for a placement!

English Exam (EETC)

B.Ed. students must write and pass the English Exam for Teacher Certification (EETC) as part of their degree program:

- Later this term, students register on Minerva for EDEC 215 (0 credit) and for EETC on CEETC website (BOTH required!)
- Exam usually takes place in November/December
- Check your McGill e-mail for updates!
- Must pass this exam prior to going on 3rd Field Experience
- Tip: Take it ASAP so you have ample opportunity to pass ahead of FE3!
