## Hiring Timelines

#### **February**

- McGill Education Career Fair: kick off for job applications (within Canada)
- Start setting up profile and teaching portfolio on <u>applytoeducation</u> watch tutorial video created by Education Career Services on <u>YouTube</u>
- Start submitting applications

#### March & April

- Continue submitting applications
- Contact private schools and keep an eye on <u>FEEP/QAIS websites</u>
- Attend recruitment events (at McGill or external): e.g. <u>Launch your Teaching Career in BC</u> or <u>ApplytoEducation Online Job Fairs</u>
- Some school boards may start interviewing as early as March

#### March, April, May & June

Interviews

#### **August**

• Last minute hiring – good time to reconnect with your network and go in person into schools

## Portrait of Education in Québec

Generally, school boards will have job postings or a general call for applications directly on their website.

### Portrait of Education in Québec

**Private/Independent Schools** – Hire independently. Approach schools individually, or check the association websites.

QAIS – Quebec Association of Independent Schools: 25 English schools (most in the Montreal region, some exceptions)

**FÉEP** – Fédération des établissements d'enseignement privés: 193 schools

**CAIS** – Canadian Accredited Independent Schools: approx. 90 schools across Canada

#### Take Action!


- Check school board websites regularly
- Apply regularly to postings<sup>1</sup>
- Send cold applications (and don't forget to follow-up)
- Contact employers to see if they are hiring (principals have hiring power!)
- Network with schools in your area & people in the field (stay in touch with CT, supervisors, principals, etc.)
- Set up information interviews or <u>career conversations</u> to network
- Get your foot in the door: substitute, tutor, extra-curricular, teacher's assistant, volunteer...
- Let family and friends know you are looking. Education is a smaller community than we might think!







1 – Some school boards (e.g. CSSDM, EMSB) reset their recruitment bank every year. Therefore it is not a problem to apply more than one time. Also, don't forget to update your application and documents if your situation changes! (e.g. French test passed, your address, etc.)

## Applying to EMSB



- EMSB does their substitute teacher hiring on <u>Apply to Education</u> or through <u>jobs@emsb.qc.ca</u>
- In most cases, you must have a teaching degree to be considered for substitution
   (\*there are exceptions to the rule, some people can start subbing after their FE3 at an EMSB school, or during their last year of B.Ed studies)
- You need to be interviewed in order to be considered for substitution
- If your interview is successful, you will receive a sub card
- Join the Facebook Group <u>EMSB substitute teachers</u>

# Applying to LBPSB



- Complete the "Substitute Teachers" online application, using <u>Apply to Education</u>
- In most cases, you must have a valid teaching permit to be considered for substitution
   (\*there are exceptions to the rule, some students can start subbing after FE3, upon special request and strong endorsement from the school Principal)
- Two ways to become <u>full</u> LBPSB employee:
  - Option 1 candidates completing their final field experience (FE4) at an LBPSB school will be interviewed at their host school during or after their final field experience
  - Option 2 other candidates should <u>apply for the annual interview period</u> in March / April, or throughout the year (as needed)
- Not all applicants will be selected for interview, and selection is prioritized according to current staffing needs
   (\*teachers qualified to instruct in French are in high demand so candidates with French certification should be sure to highlight that information on their CV)
- Candidates approved for hire will have access to the automated substitution system

## Applying to SWLSB



- Send your CV to <a href="mailto:hrsecretary@swlauriersb.qc.ca">hrsecretary@swlauriersb.qc.ca</a> or visit <a href="mailto:Substitute Teachers page">Substitute Teachers page</a> on the SWLSB website
- You will then be sent a list of documents required in order to open your file
- Once all required documents have been received by the school board, your file will be opened in SWLSB's absence management system
- You will then be given a username and password which will allow you to access (and apply for) available substitute
  jobs in SWLSB's schools
- Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board will prioritize certified teachers to be added to the substitution list (\*there are exceptions, recently SWLSB's HR representatives stated that <u>all B.Ed students</u> who have completed 15 credits or more in education courses should enroll for substitute teaching opportunities ASAP!)

## Applying to RSB



- Send updated CV and cover letter to: <u>riversidecv@rsb.qc.ca</u>
- Submit application online through the <u>SUPPLÉANCE / SUBSTITUTION</u> application portal
- For students who are not graduating this year, you can send in your CV and cover letter and if subs are needed during the school year, there is a possibility you will get an interview and be called for subbing.
- If you did a Field Experience in this school board, you may not be required to do an interview for substitution, but a reference from the school principal is needed.

## Applying to NFSB



- The New Frontiers School Board hires teachers for casual supply (substitution) in the following order of priority:
  - 1. Teachers with legal qualifications;
  - 2. Applicants who are currently enrolled in a recognized education program leading to legal qualification and have completed at least one year (30 credits);
  - 3. Applicants with a minimum of an undergraduate degree in a related field and who have a strong aptitude for working with students
- Anyone interested in applying is encouraged to visit the New Frontiers School Board jobs website
- Submit online through the SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS application on the ATE portal

#### Teacher Certification



- Visit the ISA website for all the information you need: <u>Teacher Certification for B.Ed. Students</u>
- If you are finished your courses and are waiting for your brevet, you can be granted a letter of attestation from the university stating you have successfully completed your studies, at which point you can apply for a contract.
- Teacher candidates who wish to teach in another province or in another country **must first** apply for and receive their Teacher Certification in Quebec before applying directly to the Teacher Certification office in the other relevant province or country.

Normally, all provinces recognize the teacher certification issued by other provinces without additional courses
