The MS-2 hallway is the most transited hallway on campus. Lit display cabinets are found along this hallway (pictured below). The cabinets, and more importantly the contents they display, are often outdated. This is of concern, as the dull perception formed by members of our campus community and visitors (including prospective students) can be based off the contents in display and, therefore, can undervalue the excellence and quality of work this Faculty achieves.

Updating the contents on display requires sustained human and financial resources. Moreover, with the rise of digital platforms like Facebook to instantly showcase Faculty outcomes in a timely basis, display cabinets may serve little purpose.

This project will repurpose the space along the MS-2 hallway into a shared, collaborative space for the campus community to benefit. The cabinets will be removed and replaced with modern tables and chairs, thereby creating new work space in common areas. Conceptual drawing pictured below. Power outlets will be installed along the wall for users to connect and recharge electronic devices. Lighting fixtures will be added to provide adequate lighting for working and reading. Table pods are at bar-height, and affixed to the wall for safety. Stool chairs are parallel to the wall to prevent hallway obstruction.

This project will therefore modernize a portion of our campus space, while creating new spaces for collaboration.
