

Navigating our Financial Aid Roadmap for Grad

1. Know your costs:

- Tuition and Fees (http://www.mcgill.ca/student-accounts/
- Books and/or equipment
- Renting or residence fees (http://www.mcgill.ca/students/housing/rez- options/downtown-graduate)
- Transportation, local and trips home if not from Quebec.
- Food
- Other, i.e. conferences, interest on loans, field trips etc.

2. Know Your Resources:

- **2.1. Graduate funding** Students in research-based programs are typically supported by McGill internal funding (**fellowships and assistantships**) as well as external funding (**grants and fellowships**) administered by provincial and federal governments or other agencies.

- 2.2. Government aid according to jurisdiction/residency
- 2.3. Work Study/Part-time job

Note: Our bursaries and loans are primarily for first degree students. We cannot replace core graduate funding but we can provide modest short-term loans to bridge timing of other funds, or same day emergency loans for urgent situations such as a lost wallet."






Frugal Scholar Money Management Program
