Arrival Date	Students must arrive 3-5 days before classes begin.
Orientation Day	Students will be required to attend an orientation session and will be informed about it prior to their arrival.

We require the exchange dept. of every university to send us an initial nomination letter with students' contact info. After we receive your nomination, an email will be sent directly to the nominated students containing information about the school, required documents, housing, etc.



Academic Information	
Programs and Courses	Exchange students will be able to choose their courses from 2 faculties:  1- The School of Business Administration 2- The Rothberg International School (RIS) Further details about courses will be provided to nominated students.
Credits and Course Load	Students should attend 4-5 courses (12-15 credits) in accordance with the home institution's approval and requirements.
Grade Scale and Credits	The normal workload for a full-time student is 40 HUJI credits per academic year.  Our credit calculation is based on frontal lecture hours in the semester. HUJI has not adopted the ECTS credits system, however, HUJI credits can be translated into ECTS as follows:  1 HUJI credits x 0.6 = 1 ECTS. Language of Instruction	In the School of Business Administration, there will be approximately 10 courses taught in English per semester (Graduate and Undergraduate). In RIS, all courses will be taught in English.
English Level requirement	Business Courses: We will require a letter signed by an academic official at the home university indicating proficiency in English. No TOEFL required.  For undergraduate students who wish to take courses at RIS (not business courses): a TOEFL score of 89 or IELTS 7 is required. Students studying at European institutions may submit a certificate of C1 level English proficiency signed by their University's Language Center. Graduate students can send a letter from the home university.

Services available to exchange students	<ul> <li>The International dept. at the Business School provides student advising and support from day 1 (nomination) and throughout the entire exchange term.</li> <li>RIS will provide support on all admin. and registration issues.</li> </ul>
Special Activities	The Hebrew University has a special department for international students called <u>OSL - The Office of Student Life</u> . They are responsible for organizing diverse extracurricular programs specifically designed to introduce international students to the Land of Israel – its people, geography, culture, and politics. The many exciting events, tours, and activities that complement the academic program allow participants to see the country from new angles and provide them with a comprehensive, memorable Israel experience.
Housing	Students will be able to choose to live in the Student Village (cost is approx. 600 euro/month). An application for housing will be sent to nominees. It is strongly recommended to choose this option. Information <a href="here">here</a> .  *Students must bring or purchase blankets, sheets, pillowcases, towels, and pillows as they are not supplied.
Facilities on-Premises of Student Village (Dorms)	Bar, free Wi-Fi access, Student's lounge, laundromat, convenience store. 2-minute walk to shopping center, bus, and light-rail stations.

Student Visa	All students who are planning to arrive in Israel for an exchange term must acquire a multiple-entry A/2 student visa from the <u>Israeli Consulate</u> in their country of residence. Information <u>here.</u>
