

The goal of our proposal for the available land in Kampala, Uganda is to create a community that has the opportunity for viable agricultural activities that are be organized and developed for the benefit of the local residents. By integrating agriculture on numerous levels, we diversify the types of growing that are explored while improving access to both sources of income and nutrition. In addition to the agricultural interventions, a community center, playing fields, an industrial park and an educational/training area reinforce the creation of a local identity. Services are integrated by providing access to potable water, toilet and shower facilities, each located within each cluster of lots.

Our strategies:

We propose to introduce different levels of urban agriculture providing residents with multiple options to choose from according to their needs and requirements.

- Household Urban Agriculture
The households use space within individual lots for kitchen gardens and/or raising livestock on a personal level.
- Communal Enterprise:
The residential plots cluster around shared communal space, which is used to incorporate urban agriculture on a larger scale involving community participation and cooperation.
- Marketable Produce:
To increase employment and revenue generating opportunities for the community, a major section of the site is reserved for animal husbandry and/or growing crops on a commercial scale. Adding a processing and storage area for the commercial produce further supports this activity.
