Offered at two of McGill University's affiliated rural sites, Shawville and Val-d'Or, residents will develop autonomy in their practice all while discovering beautiful regions of Quebec. The rural stream is available for 3 to 6 months of the resident's 2nd year in the Family Medicine program.
