



What programs can you apply to?

There are two categories available:

1. The **two-year** category

Selected candidates enter the program at the 2nd year of the curriculum, for residents of Quebec who hold an MD.

2. The **four-year** category

Selected candidates enter the program at the 1st year of the curriculum, for residents of Quebec, Canada or International who hold an MD or a non-medical bachelor's degree.



The 2-year Category

- The number of positions available is contingent on the number of attritions from the regular stream of the MDCM program in previous years, which may include years where there are no positions available.
- Les candidats qui font une demande d'admission dans la catégorie DHCEU 2 ans sont évalués parmi leur catégorie respective.
- Candidates who are selected are exempted from the Fundamentals of Medicine and Dentistry component (FMD) of the MDCM program and enter the program in the Transition to Clinical Practice (TPC) component, starting in April for the Med-2 (second year).



What are the academic and non-academic requirements to apply to the 2-year category?

- Recognized resident of Quebec.
- Hold a medical degree: Accredited medical school recognized by the World Health Organization (Applicants must be in good standing).
- Have obtained the <u>recognition of equivalence of a Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree from the Collège des médecins du Québec (CMQ)</u> by **December 1** of the year prior to entering the program.
- CMQ equivalency letter.
- Completion of the Medical Council of Canada exams: Regular permit to practice By recognition of the equivalence of an MD degree (cmq.org).
- MCCQE part 1 score- upload copy and share with McGill (via the <u>physiciansapply.ca</u> web portal).
- Provide a Medical Student Performance Report or Evaluation ("Dean's Letter") from their medical school.

- Upload your **unofficial transcript** (including an official translation, if the transcript is not in English or French).
- Proof of French language proficiency, please view the requirements, the list of tests and certificates that are accepted: Language Proficiency | Office of Admissions - McGill University
- English language proficiency (for candidates educated exclusively outside of Canada in non-English speaking countries), view requirement: <u>Language</u> <u>Proficiency | Office of Admissions McGill University</u>
- Curriculum Vitae and List of Verifiers
- CASPer test and distribute scores to McGill: <u>CASPer Test | Office of Admissions</u> - McGill University (Computer-Based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics)

How are applications assessed for the IMG 2?

- An <u>evaluation of academic performance</u> is conducted for all complete applications. There is no strict GPA threshold for consideration.
- In order to determine which candidates will be invited to interviews, results of academic and supplemental document evaluation are evaluated as follows:

Academic criteria:

- 63% MCCQE Part 1 (candidates need to have a passing score in the exam to move forward in the selection process)
- Medical School Performance Report

Non-academic criteria:

- 10% Curriculum vitae
- 20% CASPer score

Number of Applicants and Number of Positions available for IMG 2

Number of positions available for Spring 2024: 4

The number of positions available for the IMG program is dependent on attrition from previous years. It is possible that no positions will be available in a given year. View our admissions website in late August to see the number of positions available for 2024.

The number of applicants and accepted candidates for the IMG-2 year program for the 2023 academic year are provided as reference only:

- Number of applicants: 25
- Number of applicants invited for an interview: 10
- Number of offers: 2

The 4-year Category

- The IMG-4 admissions pathway is open to all IMG's, regardless of whether you are a resident of Quebec, Canada, or International.
- Admitted candidates will complete the 4 years of the undergraduate medical education program, with no advanced standing.
- Admission is highly competitive, IMG-4 candidates are assessed with all university degree-holding applicants in their residency category, not just other IMGs.

^{*} Note that many residents of Quebec applicants choose to apply to both the IMG-2 and IMG-4 streams.

What are the academic requirements to apply to the 4-year category?

- Citizenship: open to all IMG's regardless of your country of citizenship.
- **Medical degree**: Accredited medical school recognized by the World Health Organization (Applicants must be in good standing).
- MCCQE part 1 score- upload copy and share with McGill (via the <u>physiciansapply.ca</u> web portal).
- Upload your **unofficial transcript** (including an official translation, if the transcript is not in English or French).
- IMG-4 who hold a non-medical bachelor's degree must submit transcripts and documentation for this degree.

- CASPer test (Computer-Based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics).

- English language proficiency (for candidates educated exclusively outside of Canada in non-English speaking countries), view requirement: Language Proficiency | Office of Admissions McGill University

How are applications assessed for the IMG 4?

- An <u>evaluation of academic performance</u> is conducted for all complete applications. There is no strict GPA threshold for consideration. Academic records are evaluated and ranked in comparison with others in the same applicant category.
- In order to determine which candidates will be invited to interviews, results of academic and supplemental document evaluation are evaluated as follows:

Academic criteria:

- 63% MCCQE Part 1 (candidates need to have a passing score in the exam to move forward in the selection process)
- 7% pre-clinical and clinical assessment from transcripts and other supporting documents.

Non-academic criteria:

- 10% Curriculum vitae
- 20% CASPer score

French Language proficiency

Proof of French required to apply: Midintermediate B2 level Montreal/ C1 Campus Outaouais

- Students are introduced to clinical observation in the first year of the MDCM program, it is important to feel comfortable and prepared to work in French and English, as per the MDCM Language policy
- Ateliers médicaux offert en français et des cours en options durant le programme
- Exempt: <u>High school & Cegep</u> in QC (*Eng or Fr*)/ Post-sec studies at French institution/ CASPer in FR
- Accept: standardized tests, McGill Continuing Studies low-cost option (online written test at application deadline, followed by oral interview for short-listed candidates) registration details online www.nclcael.ca free self-assessment! Levels 6-8 = approximately B2

Designed to test your reasoning abilities and reactions linked to the medical curriculum

View how you would respond to various scenarios, as opposed to a traditional interview where you speak about your qualifications and experience



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How to submit your application and documents



Special Notes pertaining to IMG categories

- IMG applicants are not eligible to apply to the joint MDCM-PhD program and IMG 2 candidates will not be assigned to the Outaouais Campus.
- Only residents of Quebec who are applying to the IMG 4 year pathway can be assigned to the Outaouais campus.

What other options are available to you?

Postgraduate Medical Education

The McGill Postgraduate Medical Education (PGME) office welcomes applications from medical doctors who are applying for accredited residency or post-residency fellowship programs.

- PGME website: Contingent particulier | Postgraduate Medical Education McGill University
- For IMG's who are Residents of Canada, and for IMG's who did not obtain their Medical Degree in Canada or the United States, you must first pass the equivalence process with the Collège des médecins du Québec (CMQ) before you can apply for residency training.
