SECTION I

(D. Eidelman)

1. Welcoming Remarks from the Chair

The Chair welcomed Faculty Council members and guests. He welcomed several incoming members to Faculty Council as well as to the Steering and Nominating Committees (see presentation for complete list of names). He thanked everyone for their invaluable input.

2. Approval of the agenda

The Chair asked if there were any objections to approving the agenda, or if anyone had anything to add. Hearing none, the agenda was approved with no changes.

3. In Memoriam

A moment of silence was observed to remember those in our Faculty community who had recently passed: Drs. John Burgess, Hugh Bennett, Louis Beaumier, Michael Du Bow, John Crawhall, and Mortimer Lechter.

SECTION II

4. VP-Dean's update (including Financial update) *(D. Eidelman)*

The Chair provided an update on the return to campus efforts, stressing the importance of being vaccinated. He went on to discuss travel restrictions and exemptions, noting exemptions may be granted in certain cases and requests should be made via an online [form](#); questions should be addressed to the International Affairs [Office](#) (see presentation). He further highlighted the importance of staying up-to-date by visiting www.mcgill.ca/coronavirus, [reporting](#) symptoms or positive diagnoses, and about vaccine [passports](#). The Chair then provided a brief overview and update on the Faculty's budget, noting the budgetary vulnerability continues, the structural deficit remains concerning as well as an uncertain future for Middle East revenues. The Chair also noted the opportunities to grow and diversify revenues and acknowledged strong support from the Provost's office as well as the Faculty's Finance team (see presentation).

5. Career learning & development beyond the Faculty *(L. Gonnerman, A. Ryan,
N. Saad, L. Snider)*

L. Gonnerman provided a brief summary on career advising within the School of Communication Sciences and Disorders, outlining the two main streams: Master's of Science Applied and PhD (see presentation for further details).

A. Ryan discussed the various resources available at McGill to help graduate students prepare for their postgraduate career. She encouraged everyone to have their students look at [myPath](#), a confidential individualized development plan that asks them to reflect on their values and what they like to do and then provides suggestions of skills they need to gain in order to pursue that profession afterwards. She briefly presented other resources and mentioned any training sessions would be added to students' co-curricular [record](#). She further outlined the Desjardins Centre for Advance Training (DCAT) at the RI-MUHC run by Emily Bell (see presentation).

N. Saad then spoke on behalf of the WELL office and undergraduate medical career advising, which offers support groups, one on one encounters, and a list of resources including quizzes on how students can figure out what they like or what fits them (see presentation for overview and examples of career events).

L. Snider spoke about careers in rehabilitation science, noting the professional master's program is very career oriented and for which students run a job fair yearly (see presentation).

6. School of Population and Global Health: Proposed New Departments (T. Evans)

T. Evans provided an update as part of the School of Population and Global Health (SPGH) strategic plan which was presented at the previous Faculty Council meeting, noting that after much thought and consultation, it was decided to move from the original Senate approved six divisions of the School to three departments, two of which are new (see presentation). He confirmed there is no change to the Department of Epidemiology, Biostatistics and Occupational Health. The Chair thanked him for his presentation and requested a motion for approval from Faculty Council members in order for it to proceed to APC and then Senate for further approval. It was first and seconded, and without any objections, the motion passed.

7. Continuing Professional Development (CPD) webinar series update (L. Lalla)

L. Lalla provided an update on the programming for the 2021-22 program for the CPD office, in particular to the WELS and TELS courses which have been combined and are now called McGill CPD MedUpdates. It offers three live webinars per week which are archived and made available one week after the live presentation date to be viewed at one's convenience and with full credit still assigned (see presentation). She mentioned the opening session would be taking place on September 23 and [registration](#) is now open. She also presented a second course called *Essentials of Psychiatry: An Overview for Family Physicians and Other Specialists*; sessions will also be available as online accredited learning modules until May 2022 (see presentation).

The Chair confirmed that at its meeting on August 25, the Steering Committee welcomed incoming medical resident representative, Sanela Music, and reviewed and adopted the agenda for this meeting of the Faculty Council, as well as the revised Terms of Reference for the Council and its Steering Committee for ratification. Their report was made available to all members of the Faculty Council and was posted online.
