# Business Arising MDCM Language Proficiency Policy

## Background:

- MDCM Language Policy revised February 2018
  - Requirement to pass Fr/Eng language tests for admission
- Stakeholder input following revision:
  - Do not impose as an admissions requirement
- MDCM Language Policy revised July 2018
  - Verify Fr/Eng proficiency level, with goal to recommend classes and resources, vs use as a selection factor
- MDCM Admissions approved implementation for Fall 2018

# MDCM Language Proficiency Policy Implementation Plan

- Students who successfully completed a full year at a secondary/post-secondary institution whose official language is the target language, or whose admissions interview was in the target language will be considered proficient
- All others will require testing for that target language
- Students are informed of their language level and recommended courses, and other appropriate learning resources



# MDCM Language Proficiency Policy How many students may need testing?

<u>Estimate</u>: (Based on educational institution and Admissions interview language of students admitted in 2018)

TESTING NEEDED	# STUDENTS (178)
FRENCH	87 (50%)
ENGLISH	57 (30%)
NONE	34 (20%)

**Note:** Some students are likely already competent in target language, but do not have proof (education, Admissions interview).



# MDCM Language Proficiency Policy Process from Student Perspective

#### Pre-application

- Student learns about policy on Admissions website
- Student prompted to self-assess language online to encourage them to improve skills pre-admission, as needed

#### Receive Offer of Admission

 Student receives notification of whether testing is required, based on educational institution and Admissions interview

#### If testing required

- Takes test prior to program start (various dates will be offered)
- Receives results, list of resources; they choose to enroll in language courses
- Pre-clerkship survey (prior to Med-3)
  - If tested at admission, student prompted to self-report on actions taken to improve language; data will be used to improve language policy implementation, as needed



# Dean's Update McIntyre Medical Sciences Building

- July 13 fire, 5<sup>th</sup> floor terrace
- Major multi-team remediation / relocation effort
- Today:
  - Majority of floors reopened, including amphitheatres and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor classrooms
  - Work continues on remaining floors where damage was significant, including 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> as well as areas on south-side of the 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>
  - Will continue through the fall

#### Dean's Update Saudi Residents, Fellows, Students

- Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) decree in August requiring KSA students, trainees and fellows to leave Canada
- Since initial decree, advised that following individuals may remain/return:
  - Saudi medical trainees currently enrolled in medical residency, subspecialty and/or fellowship programs
  - New Saudi medical trainees accepted into training programs in Canada, for start dates in the Fall of 2018 and Winter and Spring of 2019, and who hold valid sponsorship decrees from their respective Saudi sponsoring agencies

#### Where does the money come from?

- Hard Money
  - 1A budget
  - Capital budget (restricted)
- Soft Money
  - Endowments
  - Charitable donations
  - Middle East money
  - Contracts, overhead and other business
- Flow through
  - Research grants
  - Education budget for hospitals

#### 1A Budget

- Our share of McGill's grant from government
- Primarily driven by enrolment
- Governed by the "Agreement"

#### 2018-19 Agreement - Wins and Losses

#### Wins

- Maintained forgiveness (\$3.6M)
   & freeze (x 3 yrs) repayment of Genome loan
- Approval of reserve funds for MNI North Wing
- Funds for NP program in Nursing
- Funds for Family Medicine graduate program

#### Losses

- No relief for educational administrative costs
- No new initiatives
- Did not keep promise regarding Computational Medicine

#### Soft Money

- Endowment funds: Currently the Faculty of Medicine has about \$449M in endowments, generating ~\$18M per year.
- Charitable donations: Currently get ~\$22M in donations per year.
- Contracts overhead and other business: Variable amount of money. Overhead from research (\$1M). All departments get a portion of overhead back.
- Middle East funds: Currently get ~\$18M per year after deducting the direct expenses of running the program.

#### Middle East Money

- Direct support of postgraduate medicine
- Direct support of educational and admin initiatives
  - Evaluation and assessment
  - UGME/PGME administration
  - Simulation Centre
  - Global Health
  - AECs
- Direct support of major research initiatives, incl. SRP
- Matching funds for major donations/grants



#### Where does the money go?

#### Dean's Discretionary Fund

- \$12M (mostly salaries; \$3M AECs, \$3M 1A deficit)
- Educational expenses \$4M (PGME \$3M direct funding)
- Tenure-track agreement \$2M
- Rossy Cancer Network \$1.1M
- MNI-related \$1.3M
- CERC-related \$2.7M
- Research \$2.4M



#### Spending Decisions at the DOC

- Strategic Planning
  - Educational Strategic Plan
  - Creation of core research facilities
- Urgent needs
  - Accreditation(s)
  - McIntyre Library
- Opportunities
  - Recruitment packages
  - Start-up funds
- Provostial "requests"
  - 30% of each professorial hire

#### Summary

- Income is driven mainly by enrolment, endowments and international students
- Hard money prioritized for professorial salaries, key educational programs
- We critically depend on soft money to maintain excellence in teaching and research
- We need to increase and diversify recurrent revenue sources and streams
- We are fortunate to have excellent administrative and academic affairs teams


