As is our tradition, we pay our respects to those who have passed on since our last town hall...



Yesterday we celebrated the Graduating Classes of 2012 here, and at the Central Convocation Ceremony, for Medicine, Nursing and P&OT (Communication Sciences & Disorders is fall only)/

The Medicine class will begin their residencies, which underscores another success given the final CaRMS results:

- •We filled all residency positions allocated to McGill.
- •This means we filled *all* Family Medicine residency positions allocated to us as, representing a *first* for both the Faculty and Quebec. This outcome underscores the tremendous work that has been directed to ensuring Family Medicine is well understood as a highly valued specialty. This year, we attracted a total 84 Family Medicine trainees to McGill residency positions, compared to 77 last year, 70 the year prior and 62 the year before that. If we look only at McGill MDCM students who matched to Family Medicine this year, we increased to 55, which represents 32% of the graduating class. In the last decade, the number of McGill students who have matched to Family Medicine has more than doubled, from 21 to 55.
- •Positions at the McGill Family Medicine Units in Gatineau were filled, Chateauguay and Val d'Or, bringing much needed resources to these regions.
- •As a result of the new McGill-St. Mary's Hospital Centre program launched to help international medical graduates transition into Quebec's health system, 9 additional residents will begin their training in the province this year.

The School of P&OT hosted a Strawberries and Champagne reception (June 5) to celebrate the convocation:

 - •38 BSc (Rehab Science); Major in OT
 - •48 MSc Applied (OT)
- PT graduates
 - •59 BSc (Rehab Science); Major in OT

- Graduate students
 - •1 PhD, 1 MSc (thesis), 3 MSc (non-thesis)
- •Other P&OT News: The Physiotherapy Education Accreditation Canada has reviewed our Progress Report of the Master of Science (Applied) in Physical Therapy at McGill University and has granted the program Accreditation Fully Compliant until May 2016. Indeed it was stated that "the Council frequently repeated that they felt the Program's submission was one of the best they had received in recent memory".

School is also launching new Online Chronic Pain Management certificate this fall.



The Interim Survey is a mandatory interim systematic review of all aspects of the medical school operations that was put in place by the AFMC Council of Deans in December 2009. This review is to be conducted by all medical schools in Canada with the intent of helping the schools prepare for their formal Survey.

Given McGill's next formal Accreditation is due in 2014-15, the timing is excellent to launch the Interim Survey now to complete it by February 2013.

From discussions with the Interim Review Coordinators at the medical schools that have completed the Interim Survey, they found it to be very effective in measuring compliance with standards. They found that it helped them identify areas of noncompliance or partial compliance and allowed them to address them prior to the formal Accreditation. Like at other schools, McGill is likely to benefit from this critical, formative, and rigorous process as it approaches formal Accreditation.





Rossy Cancer Centre launched March 27 at a leadership conference; a Town Hall for the McGill Oncology and other partner communities is scheduled here for June 19. Anyone who has an interest should attend.

The RCN aims to complement and leverage the strengths of each institution to promote the highest quality of care to oncology patients in our community, using common tools and information technology. The goal is to achieve a world-class comprehensive cancer network with outcomes in cancer survival, mortality and patient satisfaction as good as or better than those of the leading international centres and networks.

An Executive Director has just been announced: Dr. Robert Busilacchi, and several other support positions have been filled, e.g., site coordinators at the hospitals, Program Manager, etc.

Teams from across major teaching hospitals that have cancer missions have been working for several months, with the support of all DGs/CEOs and start-up funds from the Rossy family.

Excellent progress has been made in four work streams:

- Indicators & Outcomes (led by Dr. Gerald Batist at JGH),
- Patient Experience (led by Ms. Ann Lynch at MUHC),
- Integrated View of Patients & Data (led by Dr. Armen Aprikian at MUHC), and
- Synoptic Pathology Reporting (led by Dr. Indrojit Roy at SMHC).

While the initial focus of the RCN is on clinical outcomes, this collaboration will also yield enormous dividends in terms of research and teaching for the Faculty of Medicine. The consolidated patient outcome data created by the network will serve as a new platform for research discoveries that will have an impact on cancer care, prevention and control. These new opportunities for research will also enhance the value of our graduate and postgraduate programs.

And another network initiative...

On May 23, McGill hosted a high-profile delegation from the Swiss government, led by Mauro Dell'Ambrogio, State Secretary for Education and Research, and Ulrich Lehner, Ambassador of Switzerland to Canada and the Bahamas.

They visited McGill's downtown campus to celebrate Brain@McGill and its partnership with Neuroscience Center of Zurich. Over the course of the morning, the group took part in tours, presentations, and discussions with McGill faculty, students, and administrators.

ZNZ and Brain@McGill joined forces in October 2010 to enhance neuroscience research in fields such as pain therapy, Alzheimer's, synapse modelling and repair, neuroimmunology, and the genetic mechanisms of brain diseases. The collaboration has resulted in seven pilot projects and one workshop so far.

Founded in 2009, Brain@McGill brings together the vast amount of neuroscience knowledge available within the McGill network, including hundreds of researchers, a dozen affiliated hospitals and institutes, and three world-class partner universities: Oxford, Imperial College London, and the Neuroscience Center of Zurich (ZNZ).

The group's ambitious goals not only focus on promoting advanced medical training and groundbreaking neuroscience research, but also championing connectivity between key players in the field and linking brain research with the arts, culture, and society.



- •And while there is here is an embargo on the recent CRC and CFI LOF recipients, news is excellent.



•Dr. Nada Jabado is a hematologist, oncologist and researcher at the McGill University Health Centre Montreal Children's Hospital. She is also an associate professor, department of pediatrics and an associate member, department of medicine, division of experimental medicine at McGill University.

- •Dr. Razack is Assistant Dean of Admissions, Equity, and Diversity, Associate Professor of Pediatrics, and Core Faculty at the Centre for Medical Education at McGill University. He practices as a pediatric critical care medicine physician. His major interests in medical education include assessment, equity issues, and social accountability in health professions education.
- •Dr. Makeda Semret, a McGill alumna, is Assistant Professor, Department of Medicine Infectious Diseases and Medical Microbiology St Mary's Hospital Centre and McGill University Health Centre. Dr Semret was awarded the prize for her instrumental role in the establishment of an Infectious Disease (ID) training program at Addis Ababa University (AAU) in Ethiopia. By sharing important knowledge in the field of ID, Dr Semret and her colleagues are helping to train medical residents of AAU so they can in turn train future generations of physicians.
