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## **Position description**

The Department of Psychiatry at McGill University is currently inviting applications for a full-time position as a member of the Contract Academic Staff at the rank of Assistant Professor (Clinical). This will be a three-year, renewable appointment.

The successful candidate will have a broad range of clinical abilities in adult outpatient psychiatry, and an academic track record demonstrated by experience in education and/or an active research dossier. The candidate will be appointed to clinical practice at St. Mary’s Hospital Center, within the Centre Intégré Universitaire de Santé et de Services Sociaux de l’Ouest de l’Île de Montréal (CIUSSS-ODIM).

St. Mary’s Hospital Center is a university affiliated, community hospital, serving a multicultural population, seeking to provide the highest level of safe patient- and family-focused care. The Department of Psychiatry comprises both adult and geriatric psychiatry divisions, and offers second-line outpatient, inpatient, ER/crisis, and consultation-liaison psychiatry services to the Côte des Neiges community, one of Montreal’s more diverse and multicultural neighborhoods with a large immigrant and student population. Specialized mental health services are provided in partnership with first-line services offered by CLSC Côte des Neiges (CSSS Montagne). The department is proud to host a respectful, multi-disciplinary and inclusive work setting in its multiple areas of activity, which includes the training of a diverse group students and other allied health professionals. There are opportunities to collaborate with the hospital’s research unit, with current research projects in adult and geriatric psychiatry as well as maternal mental health.

The department is affiliated with McGill, Canada’s most international university, which is located in vibrant, multicultural Montreal, in the francophone province of Quebec.

## **Job Duties**

The successful candidate will be expected to provide excellent clinical teaching and supervision to residents and medical students, participate in hospital administrative activities, pursue scholarly activities, and make innovative contributions to the academic mission of the department, as well as demonstrate a strong commitment to equity, diversity, and inclusion in all areas.

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## Qualifications and Education requirements

### Requirements:

- Applicants must have completed advanced Psychiatry training (fellowship/graduate studies).
- Applicants must hold or be eligible for licensure as a psychiatrist in the province of Quebec.
- An advanced capacity to engage in all aspects of a university-affiliated psychiatry department is required.
- Bilingual language competencies (French and English) are also required.

### Assets:

- Clinician-scientists with MD/PhD (or equivalent research-intensive training) are encouraged.
- Strong clinical/academic background working with patients diagnosed with common mental health problems (mood/anxiety disorders), substance use disorders, and personality disorders.
- Interest/experience in administration/medical leadership.
