## CANS 492 JOINT HONOURS THESIS APPROVAL FORM

Students writing a Joint Honours Thesis will seek a supervising professor (thesis advisor) in one of the two disciplines in which the Joint Honours program is being followed. Upon agreement between the student and the advisor on the topic of thesis and the evaluation criteria for the thesis, students must complete and submit this form to the Program Director of Canadian Studies for final approval. This form must be completed, signed and approved before registering in CANS 492 or CANS 492D1/D2, and before the end of Add/Drop Session. The thesis is expected to be about 10,000 words in length. Upon completion of the thesis (before the end of the exam period), the student must submit one copy to the thesis advisor for grading and another to the Program Director for Canadian Studies. The thesis advisor will be asked to submit the grade to the Program Director for Canadian Studies, who will ensure that the mark is recorded on the student's record.
