CANS 480 / 481 HONOURS THESIS APPROVAL FORM

Students will seek a faculty member who will supervise the writing of their thesis. When the student and advisor have agreed on an outline and evaluation criteria for the thesis, this form should be completed and submitted to the Program Director of Canadian Studies for final approval. This form must be completed, signed and approved before registering in CANS 480/481 and before the end of Add/Drop Session. The thesis is expected to be about 10,000 words in length. Upon completion of the thesis (before the end of the exam period), the student must submit one copy to the thesis advisor for grading and another to the Program Director for Canadian Studies. The thesis advisor will be asked to submit the grade to the Program Director for Canadian Studies, who will ensure that the mark is recorded on the student's record.
