



## YOUTH AND MUSIC The 32<sup>nd</sup> Season of the CBC/McGill Concert Series

Montreal, November 1, 2010 – **CBC Montreal** and McGill University's **Schulich School of Music** are once again proud to join forces for another concert season of musical excellence. Some of Canada's finest young musicians will take the stage to share their commitment and passion for music with Montreal's concert-going public and with CBC listeners across the country.

For this 32<sup>nd</sup> anniversary edition, the CBC/McGill Series will focus on young Montreal musicians in four concerts during the month of November. The Series begins with two CBC recital debuts: **Vincent Lauzer**, recorder (November 14<sup>th</sup>) and **Alexander Read**, violin (November 21<sup>st</sup>). These first two concerts take place at a new time, 2.00 PM on Sunday afternoons in Redpath Hall.

Also featured in the series is the **McGill Jazz Orchestra 1** in a special concert hosted by CBC Montreal's **Katie Malloch**. Finishing up the series is the annual **CBC/McGill Youth Choir Gala**, with guest conductor Matthias Maute leading the massed choir in music from Mexico and Spain. This concert will be hosted by CBC Montreal's **Jennifer Hall**.

The CBC/McGill Concert Series is a showcase for new Canadian talent in a variety of musical genres, a reflection of the inclusive service offered by the new CBC Radio 2 mandate. The Series is the longest-standing partnership between the CBC and a Canadian university music faculty.

Concerts are recorded for broadcast on **In Concert** with host **Bill Richardson** (heard Sundays from 11 am to 3 pm), **Choral Concert** with host Peter Togni (heard Sundays at 9:00 am to 11:00 am), **Tempo** with host **Julie Nesrallah** (heard weekdays at 9 am to 2 pm), and **Tonic** with host Katie Malloch (heard Monday to Thursdays from 8 pm to 10 pm).
