The Clavisphere places the audience within a multi-dimensional aura of the piano. Within this environment, we encourage the audience to experience an immersive relationship between space, sound and musical history. For over 600 years, the clavier has undergone tremendous cultural and technological transformations. Clavisphere places

the audience within this context, deconstructing the piano not just from the point of view of its sonority but also its mechanics, associated performance gestures and its ability to speak to our memories, and cultural experiences. Each piece on the program takes its own point of view of the piano, providing further insight into an instrument that has not only become a tool for musical expression but also as a symbol for cultural experience.
