



Welcoming the Susan E. French Chairholder

Following an international search and selection process, the Ingram School of Nursing (ISoN) recruited Dr. Kelley Kilpatrick as the Susan E. French Chair in Nursing Research and Innovative Practice (SEF Chair) in fall 2018. Supported by the Newton Foundation endowed by Mr. Richard Ingram, the Chair is named after former ISoN Director and Officer of the Order of Canada Dr. Susan E. French.

Dr. Kilpatrick obtained her bachelor, master, and doctoral degrees in nursing at McGill University. She completed a one-year postdoctoral fellowship with the Canadian Health Services Research Foundation/Canadian Institutes of Health Research Chair Program in Advanced Practice Nursing at McMaster University. She conducts research at the Research Centre of the Centre intégré universitaire de santé et de services sociaux (CIUSSS) de l'Est-de-l'Île-de-Montréal – Hôpital Maisonneuve-Rosemont. She has published over 100 papers and reports, and given 160 presentations locally, nationally, and internationally.

Dr. Kilpatrick's research focuses on team processes to open the 'black box' of how advanced practice nursing roles (e.g., clinical nurse specialist, nurse practitioner) support teams and enhance

care. She developed a conceptual framework to link system-level structures to team processes and outcomes. This framework includes patients and families as team members, providing new insights into how patient/lay involvement in care improve outcomes. Working closely with key stakeholders – from faculty members to directors of nursing, clinicians, administrators, regulators, and professional/patient associations – her work has influenced the implementation of promising nursing roles within Quebec and internationally. This SEF Chair is a natural extension of Dr. Kilpatrick's research program.



The McGill Nursing Collaborative Contributions

By the Collaborative Coordination Committee*

The McGill Nursing Collaborative for Education and Innovation in Patient- and Family-Centered Care is a partnership among the ISoN and the nursing departments of the McGill University Health Centre (MUHC) and the CIUSSS du Centre-Ouest-de-l'Île-de-Montréal (Jewish General Hospital [JGH] Site).

Inaugurated in 2012 with a \$6-million donation from the Newton Foundation, McGill Faculty of Medicine, and the foundations and donors from both the MUHC and JGH, the Collaborative's goal is to advance nursing research, practice and education through the combined efforts of its members.

The Collaborative has over 30 ongoing projects, impacting over 1,000 people and gaining visibility on the national and international levels. These projects have been a source of scholarly productivity, generating 9 manuscripts, 16 oral presentations, and 4 poster presentations.

The McGill Collaborative embarked on several new and exciting ventures in 2018 and 2019, including:

The *Approche adaptée à la personne âgée* (AAPA) directive from the Ministry of Health and Social Services (MSSS) for the prevention of functional decline and delirium in hospitalized elderly patients.

Addressing delirium in the clinical context is challenging, despite strong efforts in teaching and education. In 2017, JGH, ISoN and MUHC AAPA nurse leaders created a working

group to increase our understanding of the barriers and facilitators to optimal delirium care with respect to interprofessional practice. Results will serve to identify targets for training interventions, as well as to inform the MSSS ministerial directive.

Leadership Development – LEADS training

As part of the ISoN Leadership Development initiative, ISoN, MUHC, and JGH nurse leaders took part in four training sessions presented by LEADS Canada in winter 2018. These training sessions instructed participants in how to apply the LEADS framework, a conceptual model for understanding the essential skills and knowledge for effective leadership in the field of health care. Overall, 45 nurse leaders from all 3 sites participated, providing an opportunity to strengthen and leverage clinical-academic relationships.



Nightingale Fellows Project

The year 2018 marked the full rollout of the Nightingale Fellows Project, a mentoring program wherein small groups of nursing students in their final year of study receive mentorship and support from nurses currently working in clinical settings in Montreal. Mentors met four times with their small groups to provide both an inside look at the challenges of transitioning into clinical practice and a safe environment for students to ask questions and discuss their concerns.

Nursing Collaborative Journal Club Series

This initiative launched in spring 2017, with the objective of further honing the critical literature appraisal skills of ISoN students and faculty members, as well as nurses in staff and managerial positions at the MUHC and JGH. Three Journal Clubs were held in 2018 and

featured authors Nathalie Rodrigue, Christina Clausen, and Nancy Feeley, who presented their respective research publications. As many as seven different sites were connected via videoconferencing for each Journal Club, allowing over 70 people to participate simultaneously in the discussions.

New Network Leadership

DR. CÉLINE GÉLINAS (pictured left) has been selected as Co-Director of RRISIQ. Dr Gélinas is the third successive McGill researcher (Celeste Johnston & Nancy Feeley) to lead the network since its inception in 2003 as a FRQS-funded group. ISoN researchers lead one of the RRISIQ's three axes and co-lead the knowledge mobilization platform. McGill constitutes 14% of the researcher membership and holds 28% of RRISIQ leadership roles.

For the past decade, the RRISIQ Co-Director Dr. Nancy Feeley, showed keen leadership and dedication. She has been integral to the creation and expansion of the network.


New Scientific Journal for the RRISIQ

In June 2018 the RRISIQ launched an online, bilingual, open access journal,

Science of Nursing and Health Practices.

Since then, 54 manuscripts were submitted with a 35% acceptance rate. There are 4 -5 publications per issue. The publications were downloaded 4,121 times between April 2019-2020. Consider submitting a manuscript!

Montreal to host the 2023 International Council of Nurses (ICN) Congress

The RRISIQ's Co-Directors worked with the Canadian Nurses Association (CNA) and the Palais des Congrès and won the bid to host the International Congress of Nursing (ICN) in Montreal in 2023. ICN is a major international scientific event attended by 8,000 nurses and will be one of the largest scientific meetings ever to take place in Montreal. In recognition of this, DR. NANCY FEELEY (pictured above), past RRISIQ Co-Director, was named one of the ambassadors of the Palais and honoured by the Palais and the Chief Scientist of Quebec at an event in February 2020. Support for knowledge production

One of the RRISIQ's main funders, the Ministry of Health and Social Services (MSSS) increased their contribution with a request for the RRISIQ to hold a special competition based on their current priorities. Fifty percent of \$100,000 grants were awarded to McGill Principal Investigators (Gélinas, Kilpatrick & Maheu). McGill researchers (Kilpatrick, Lavoie-Tremblay & Rennick) were co-investigators on other teams as well.

Promoting interprofessional research

In 2015, the RRISIQ was the first Quebec network to initiate new partnerships with other FRQS research networks. The RRISIQ created a jointly funded project competition to strengthen interprofessional research capacity in Quebec. In 2019, competitions were held with two new partners:

1. Cardiometabolic Health, Diabetes and Obesity Research Network (CMDO) and
2. Réseau québécois de recherche en soins palliatifs et de fin de vie (RQSPAL).




Research *Funding* Awarded in 2018 & 2019


Active Funding in 2019


