JOB DESCRIPTION & OTHER INFORMATION
This clinical course focuses on nursing care related to pregnancy, labor and delivery, infant transition to extra-uterine life, post-natal recovery, and the taking on of parenting roles within a young family developmental perspective. It provides a context for students to purposefully practice and reinforce learning in the 6 CASN domains (knowledge, communication/collaboration, research, professionalism,

clinical practice, and leadership) in relation to perinatal/family health. Students will integrate theoretical knowledge and skills acquired in previous and concurrent courses.

The Clinical Instructor (CI) will supervise a group of first-year students on hospital maternity units. Details on exact placement areas will be available in early December

Role Expectations:

- Teaches and directly supervises a group of students in fulfilling the course objectives, including patient selection, and facilitating experiences with perinatal patients and their families. Supports student learning by assessing the student's learning style and providing the appropriate teaching strategy.
- Provides formative and summative clinical performance assessment to students including documenting the students' learning throughout the course.
- Meets with course coordinators to review course objectives; communicates with the course coordinator about any concerns related to student learning.
- Works with the clinical unit leadership to promote the best student learning experience possible.
- Organizes and leads group clinical conference and debriefing
- Accesses MyCourses regularly and communicates with students by email, as necessary

Clinical Placement and Hours Details:

Clinical groups will be on the units for one (1) 8-hour shift per week and may include days, evenings, or weekends. The clinical days are Mondays Tuesdays, Wednesdays and/or weekends. Exact schedule is subject to change depending on clinical placement availability.

- Applicants can apply for more than 1 group (e.g., multiple days).

Please note that given the resumption of in-person teaching activities, most courses will be taught in person. Exams may however need to be administered remotely depending, mainly on the size of the class. Course Lecturers will be required to plan accordingly. Should government restrictions prohibit the resumption of in person teaching, courses will revert to remote teaching. In the event of such a change, Course Lecturers will be advised without delay. Course Lecturers may be required to prepare and deliver teaching material suited to a remote/online teaching environment using a virtual learning platform [e.g., Zoom, WebEx] and the McGill myCourses learning management system. Training and assistance on remote teaching is available through Teaching and Learning Services (TLS) . Course Lecturers are encouraged to record their lectures.
