JOB DESCRIPTION & OTHER INFORMATION

- This intensive clinical nursing experience focuses on the assessment and care of individuals and their families dealing with a critical and potentially life-threatening health event. Students are placed in critical care units throughout the McGill teaching hospital network (e.g. ER, ICU, NICU) based on the availability of units. Details on exact placement areas will be available in early December. This is a clinical instructor-based course for ½ of the students in the course (the other ½ will be placed preceptored).

Please note: This position may be converted to clinical instructor based on the clinical settings realities

Role Expectations:

- Support preceptors and students (approximately 25 dyads) in the clinical setting (multiple sites) through visits or Zoom visits to clinical settings as well as by email, MyCourses, or telephone as needed.
- Support clinical preceptors in relation to teaching/learning principles, enhancing clarification of course objectives, student evaluation, and relevant university policies/procedures.
- Answer student and preceptor questions in a timely manner
- Support preceptors in completing clinical performance assessment as needed and review/discuss with course coordinator as needed
- Promote a healthy learning environment

Clinical Placement and Hours Details:

Rotation 1: Orientation on January 5, 2022.

Clinical days: January 6 to February 25, 2022.

Rotation 2: Orientation on March 7, 2022.

Clinical days: March 8 to April 23, 2022.

Please note that given the resumption of in-person teaching activities, most courses will be taught in person. Exams may however need to be administered remotely depending, mainly on the size of the class. Course Lecturers will be required to plan accordingly. Should government restrictions prohibit the resumption of in person teaching, courses will revert to remote teaching. In the event of such a change, Course Lecturers will be advised without delay. Course Lecturers may be required to prepare and deliver teaching material suited to a remote/online teaching environment using a virtual learning platform [e.g., Zoom, WebEx] and the McGill myCourses learning management system. Training and assistance on remote teaching is available through Teaching and Learning Services (TLS) . Course Lecturers are encouraged to record their lectures.
