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JOB DESCRIPTION & OTHER INFORMATION

This intensive clinical nursing experience focuses on the assessment and care of individuals and their families dealing with a critical and potentially life-threatening health event. Students are placed in critical care units throughout the McGill teaching hospital network and other community partners across the reseau (e.g., ER, ICU, NICU) based on the availability of units. Details on exact placement areas will be available in early December. This is a clinical instructor-based course for ½ of the students in the course (the other ½ will be placed preceptored).

Please note: This position may be converted to preceptor Support based on the clinical settings realities.

Role Expectations:

- Teaches and directly supervises a group of students in fulfilling the course objectives, including patient selection and facilitating experiences with critical care patients and their families.
- Supports student learning by assessing the student's learning style and providing the appropriate teaching strategy.
- Provides formative and summative clinical performance assessment to students including documenting the students' learning throughout the course.
- Meets with course coordinators to review course objectives; communicates with the course coordinator about any concerns related to student learning.
- Works with the clinical unit leadership to promote the best student learning experience possible.
- The Clinical Instructor (CI) will supervise and instruct a group of 6 students in critical care
 clinical settings and help the students make critical links, use their clinical reasoning skills.
 Using a Strengths-based approach, the CI will teach students who are in their 3^{rd (}final) year of
 studies to help them integrate their final stage and be prepared to begin their career in
 nursing.
- Clinical groups will be on the units for four (4) 8-hour shifts per week and may include days, evenings, weekends and/or 12-hour shifts. Clinical instructors may also share groups, depending on their availability (e.g. 2 days per week each). The clinical days are Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays (subject to change). This clinical course is organized into two sections of 6 weeks each.

Clinical Placement and Hours Details:

- Rotation 1: January 6th, 2022 to February 25th, 2022 = 192 hours (20 clinical days at 8 hours /day = 160 clinical teaching + remaining hours for orientation and student assessments) clinical teaching is Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday on days and evenings with occasional week-ends as needed (8 hour shift) with possibility of 12 hour shifts for less days of the week pending finalization of placements with agencies. Clinical Instructor Orientation on January 5th, 2022.
- Rotation 2: March 8th, 2022 to April 23, 2022 = 192 hours (20 clinical days at 8 hours /day = 160 clinical teaching + remaining hours for orientation and student assessments) clinical teaching is Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday on days and evenings with occasional week-ends as needed (8 hour shift) with possibility of 12 hour shifts for less days of the week pending finalization of placements with agencies. Clinical Instructor Orientation on March 7th, 2022.
- **Applicants can apply for one or both rotations** (also, potential for splitting contract between two people.)

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Please note that given the resumption of in-person teaching activities, most courses will be taught in person. Exams may however need to be administered remotely depending, mainly on the size of the class. Course Lecturers will be required to plan accordingly. Should government restrictions prohibit the resumption of in person teaching, courses will revert to remote teaching. In the event of such a change, Course Lecturers will be advised without delay. Course Lecturers may be required to prepare and deliver teaching material suited to a remote/online teaching environment using a virtual learning platform [e.g., Zoom, WebEx] and the McGill myCourses learning management system. Training and assistance on remote teaching is available through Teaching and Learning Services (TLS). Course Lecturers are encouraged to record their lectures.
