Qualifying Year

Key Points

- 1) Qualifying Year to MSc (A) is NOT an automatic progression.
 - You must complete your QY year successfully
 - You will be required to apply to the Master's program during your QY year
 - The admission criteria are the same for all students applying to the MSc (A)
 - Application fees are not waived
- 2) Although Qualifying Year is NOT a formal program of study, you as students are considered Graduate Students. You are part of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies and therefore the (GPS) Policies and Procedures apply to you.
- 3) By University definition, students in the Qualifying Year are NOT eligible for internal or external funding opportunities. The ISoN will notify you of any funding sources that you would be eligible for.
