Social Sciences	Humanities	Languages	Math & Science	<p>If you were admitted to the Freshman program, list the courses you have used to complete your freshman requirements. (See https://www.mcgill.ca/oasis/students/new/freshman-u0)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Core Courses: You must complete a minimum of 6 credits in three of the four freshman course categories. A maximum of 18 credits can be chosen in any one category. No more than 12 credits may be taken in one department (ex: PHIL, ECON, HISP) <p>IMPORTANT: When you enter your U1 year (96 or fewer credits) and select a program of study, your departmental adviser will confirm whether a course completed as a freshman requirement can be used to complete a departmental program requirement.</p>

Step 1: Select your program(s) of study

Students who are in their U1 year of study (96 or fewer credits) must select at least [two different programs](#) (i.e. at least one Major Concentration/Honours and one Minor Concentration) in two different academic departments/units and enter these [programs of study](#) on [Minerva](#) to have priority when registering for courses.

Step 2: Plan your courses for each program of study

A. Review the [requirements of your degree](#) and programs of study and verify that you have completed the correct pre-requisite or placement test for each of the courses you will be taking by checking the **current** McGill eCalendar. (See <https://www.mcgill.ca/study/>)

B. Enter the McGill courses needed for each program of study on the "Arts OASIS Degree Planning Worksheet" following these [instructions](#).

Note that no course may fulfil the requirements for more than one program or concentration requirement.

Exception: With the approval of your departmental program adviser, a freshman course taken at the 200 level or higher and completed with a grade of C or better, may count towards both your U0 requirements **and** your program requirements.

If a course cannot be used to complete a program requirement, it must be entered in the "ELECTIVE" column. For example, courses taken at the 100 level, completed with a grade below C or taken under the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory grading option, cannot be used to satisfy a program requirement and must be entered in the "ELECTIVE" column.

- Enter the year for each term and the McGill courses you have completed in the correct column for each term of study.
- Enter the McGill courses you have **in progress** in the correct column and term of study.
- Enter the McGill courses you have **remaining to complete** for **each program** in **each remaining term** in the correct column and term of study. Use the current McGill eCalendar to check the term in which a course is offered.

C. Inform yourself about the important faculty policies on **course load, course overlap, taking courses outside of the Faculties of Arts and Science** and selecting the **Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory grading option** on the following website. (See <https://mcgill.ca/oasis/academic/courses>)

Step 3: Consult your Departmental Program Advisers

It is strongly recommended that you consult with the Departmental Program Adviser in each of your programs of study to help guide your course selection and ensure that you are meeting your program requirements. (See <https://www.mcgill.ca/oasis/advising/departmental-advising-information>)
