## Foreword by the Chair

The Department's Strategic Planning Retreat on April 6, 2019 was a big success with over 70 attendees representing both our research and clinical faculty members. With the guidance of the facilitator, Mr. Ken Steele, attendees provided valuable feedback on what they felt were priorities for the Department. While budgetary realities limit what is feasible, some suggestions have been implemented. For example, in September the Department hired a Senior Data Analyst, Dr. Farzin Khosrow-Khavar, to assist Department members and their trainees with the design, execution, analysis, and reporting of a wide range of cancer research studies. He has been working with several Department members including Drs. Tamim Niazi, Jan Seuntjens, Thierry Muanza, Mark Basik and Joanne Alfieri. He also is involved on a project with the Rossy Cancer Network.

In 2019, I created the 5-member Chair's Executive Committee to provide input to me on matters related to Academic Programs (Dr. Gayle Shinder), Educational Affairs (Dr. Joanne Alfieri), Clinical Affairs (Dr. Wilson Miller) and Administrative Affairs (Ms. Christina Raneburger – Associate Director, AEC-7). I also appointed Dr. Tarek Hijal as Director of Radiation Oncology (he was serving as Interim Director).

In March 2019 we welcomed our new Communication and Events Administrator/VSPO Coordinator, Ms. Saadia Agha. Ms. Agha has connections with the Canada-Pakistan Affiliated Chamber of Trade (CPACT) and facilitated an affiliation between our Department and that organization. In December I signed a Letter of Intent for fundraising activities with CPACT focusing on our educational mission.

Our Third Gerald Bronfman Department of Oncology Distinguished Lecture and Awards Ceremony was held on October 7, 2019. This year's Distinguished Lecturer was Dr. Richard Margolese who spoke about the history of breast cancer treatment. Award winners were Dr. Antoine Loutfi (Lifetime Achievement), Dr. Jan Seuntjens (Research or Clinical Service), Dr. Tamim Niazi (Teaching and Mentorship) and Ms. Jacqueline Vachon (Academic, Clinical or Research Support). This year, the Department of Oncology/Rossy Cancer Network's Kuok Fellowships were awarded to MSc candidates, Mr. Kenneth Drummond, Ms. Ankita Ghatak and Ms. Sarah Mackay.

We continued our popular "Focus on Faculty" profile series which I began in June 2015, with profiles in basic cancer research (Dr. Sonia del Rincon, Dr. Miltiadis Paliouras); clinical research (Dr. Phil Gold); gynecologic oncology (Dr. Walter Gotlieb, Dr. Lucy Gilbert); medical oncology (Dr. Michael Pollak, Dr. Wilson Miller); radiation oncology (Dr. Luis Souhami); surgical oncology (Dr. Sender Liberman); medical physics (Mr. William Parker); palliative/supportive care (Dr. Krista Lawlor); and psychosocial oncology (Dr. Argerie Tsimicalis).

The Medical Physics Unit had a noteworthy year: They received a positive assessment during their Cyclical Review; On November 7<sup>th</sup> they celebrated 40 years of medical physics at McGill with a symposium and panel discussion as well as the presentation of the 2019-2020 Podgorsak Fellowship.

On July 5<sup>th</sup> the Division of Cancer Epidemiology, which I lead, had a special seminar and celebration to commemorate the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Division. We were joined by a delegation of the Cancer Research Society which supports the Division.

As we looked ahead to 2020 we were planning to celebrate the Department's 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary year with: (i) the launch of our Graduate Diploma in Oncology and its six new courses which received approval from the various university committees in 2019 and was granted final approval by Senate in January

2020; (ii) the launch of the new Department website; (iii) a fundraising event in collaboration with CPACT; (iv) Symposium and Awards Ceremony; (v) Resident-organized symposium; vi) Public Lecture in collaboration with the Goodman Cancer Research Centre. The COVID-19 pandemic has derailed some of those plans however we are happy to report that we have launched the Graduate Diploma in Oncology and the courses which will begin in September 2020. The courses will be delivered online. We also have launched the new Department website, <a href="www.mcgill.ca/oncology">www.mcgill.ca/oncology</a>. The events we were planning will be postponed to 2021.

## **Summary of Department Activities**

#### 1. Research and Publications

Cancer-related research, teaching and clinical care are conducted throughout McGill and its affiliated hospitals, namely at the Goodman Cancer Research Centre, the McGill University Health Centre (MUHC) including the Cedars Cancer Centre and the MUHC Research Institute, the Jewish General Hospital (JGH) including the Segal Cancer Centre (Lady Davis Institute), St. Mary's Hospital Centre (SMHC) and at the Department's headquarters located at 5100 de Maisonneuve Blvd. West, Suite 720. Cancer-related research activities at McGill include:

- Basic research focusing on understanding at the molecular, cellular, and tissue levels the development and growth of tumours and their resistance to therapy;
- Translational research for the development and testing of novel therapeutics; biomarkers, and molecular signatures as targets for cancer detection or treatment;
- Phase I, II and III clinical research studies testing the efficacy of new cancer treatment therapies;
- Radiation physics studies to improve the delivery of radiotherapy;
- Genetic studies of inherited susceptibility to cancer;
- Epidemiological studies of the etiology, prevention, screening, and prognosis for several cancers;
- Psychosocial research aimed at improving the emotional well-being and quality of life of cancer
  patients and their families, and managing pain and other symptoms of the disease;
- Health systems research aimed at improving the quality of cancer care and clinical outcomes.

# Major Funding (our researchers are successful in earning many grants but these are special....)

- Stand Up to Cancer Canada **Nahum Sonenberg** and **Michael Pollak** received \$6 million to lead a pan-Canadian multidisciplinary team of researchers to develop new and improved approaches in the treatment and care of metastatic breast cancer.
- The Quebec Cancer Consortium for Novel Therapeutics and Biomarkers, led by the Goodman Cancer Research Centre, received \$10 million in new funding from the Ministère de l'Économie et de l'innovation du Québec to develop novel therapeutics and biomarkers for cancer.
