Foreword by the Chair

The Department of Oncology celebrated its 30th anniversary in 2020. To showcase the vibrant history of the Department an article was written (*McGill Oncology – Traveling through time, looking back and seeing the future,* by **Gayle A. Shinder** and **Eduardo L. Franco**) and posted on the home page of the new Department website which was launched in early 2020 (www.mcgill.ca/oncology). In addition, a <u>video</u> was created and the link was posted on the Department website and social media platforms. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, three events that were to be part of the 30th anniversary celebration were put on hold: (i) a fundraising event in collaboration with the Canada-Pakistan Affiliated Chamber of Trade (CPACT) which was to be held on April 5, 2020; (ii) a resident-organized symposium; iii) a Public Lecture in collaboration with the Goodman Cancer Research Centre.

The 4th Gerald Bronfman Department of Oncology Symposium and Awards Ceremony was held on December 1, 2020. The event was held virtually via Zoom with livestreaming on YouTube. The webcast is available for viewing at <u>https://youtu.be/eKEcvloif48</u>. This year's Distinguished Lecturer was **Bernard Lapointe** who presented on the History of Palliative Care at McGill and in Quebec. Departmental merit awards were presented to **Peter Siegel** (Research or Clinical Service), **Koren Mann** (Teaching and Mentorship) and **Majid Ghahremani** (Academic, Clinical or Research Support). **Vera Hirsh** was the recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award. There was also a special presentation of the Female Champions of Cancer Education, Research, and Care (in partnership with the Canada-Pakistan Affiliated Chamber of Trade –CPACT and South Asian Women Association of Canada - SAWAC) which was originally slated for the CPACT fundraising event. The recipients of the award were: **Nicole Beauchemin**, *For her enduring legacy as scientist, mentor and teacher of the fundamentals of cancer care in Quebec;* and **Anna Towers**, *For her international leadership developing lymphedema treatment services for cancer patients*.

I created two task forces to address pressing needs in cancer control and care both locally and globally:

- The McGill Task Force on the Impact of COVID-19 on Cancer Control and Care is chaired by Wilson Miller. The goal of this task force is to prepare a contingency plan to mitigate risks for individuals with cancer in the McGill health network. Data (previous years to the present day) focusing on various aspects of cancer-related services across the network is being collected to determine which activities associated with cancer screening and care have been supressed or altered due to the pandemic and how this has affected outcomes.
- 2. The Task Force on Global Oncology is chaired by Tarek Hijal. The mandate of this task force is the development and implementation of a vision for global oncology education, research, policy, and service. I created this task force in response to a broader call for action in global health from the Faculty's School of Population and Global Health, and we will share information with them regarding the task force's activities.

We continued our popular "Focus on Faculty" profile series which I began in June 2015. This year there was a heavier focus on basic cancer research due to busy clinician schedules as they adapted to hospital changes as a result of the pandemic. As of 2020 the Gerald Bronfman Department of Oncology and the Rossy Cancer Network (RCN) have an agreement whereby the Department Chair's Office will take over coordination of the RCN's Cancer Care Quality and Innovation (CQI) Research Fund and Education Fund (Skills Enhancement Grant and Kuok Fellowship) competitions. In November a Call for Applications was announced for the 2020 Edition of the CQI Research Fund with January 15, 2021 as the deadline for submissions. In 2021 the Department will work on implementing a new round of Skills Enhancement Grants and a Kuok Fellowship competition.

In the 2019 Annual Report I mentioned that the Department hired a Senior Data Analyst **Farzin Khosrow-Khavar**, to assist Department members and their trainees with the design, execution, analysis, and reporting of cancer research studies. He has been working on a number of projects with Department faculty members and has been assisting with Rossy Cancer Network projects. He will be leaving the Department sometime in 2021 and we are in the process of looking for his replacement.

Summary of Department Activities

1. Research and Publications

Cancer-related research, teaching and clinical care are conducted throughout McGill and its affiliated hospitals, namely at the Goodman Cancer Research Centre, the McGill University Health Centre (MUHC) including the Cedars Cancer Centre and the MUHC Research Institute, the Jewish General Hospital (JGH) including the Segal Cancer Centre (Lady Davis Institute), St. Mary's Hospital Center (SMHC) and at the Department's headquarters located at 5100 de Maisonneuve Blvd. West, Suite 720. Cancer-related research activities at McGill include:

- Basic research focusing on understanding at the molecular, cellular, and tissue levels the development and growth of tumours and their resistance to therapy;
- Translational research for the development and testing of novel therapeutics; biomarkers, and molecular signatures as targets for cancer detection or treatment;
- Phase I, II and III clinical research studies testing the efficacy of new cancer treatment therapies;
- Radiation physics studies to improve the delivery of radiotherapy;
- Genetic studies of inherited susceptibility to cancer;
- Epidemiological studies of the etiology, prevention, screening, and prognosis for several cancers;
- Psychosocial research aimed at improving the emotional well-being and quality of life of cancer patients and their families, and managing pain and other symptoms of the disease;
- Health systems research aimed at improving the quality of cancer care and clinical outcomes.

- Martin Chasen and colleagues 1.4 million from Health Canada Health Care Policy and Strategies Program for the RELIEF (Remote Self-Reporting of Symptoms by Patients with Palliative Care Needs) study.
- In a news release, the Government of Canada announced that it will be contributing up to \$6.7 million to the biotechnology company, Arch Biopartners, as its lead drug candidate, Metablok (LSALT peptide) will be tested on hospitalized COVID-19 patients. LSALT peptide was developed by Stephen Robbins and Donna Senger and their team at the University of Calgary. Both recently have been appointed to the Gerald Bronfman Department of Oncology, and Dr. Robbins will serve as the Director of the Lady Davis Institute at the Jewish General Hospital

- **Catherine Goudie** \$1 million grant from TD Ready Challenge for her application, MIPOGG (McGill Interactive Pediatric OncoGenetic Guidelines).

- Jian Hui Wu Funding from Health Canada to use various assays to screen the approved drug database of the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in order to evaluate the best candidates which could be used against COVID-19.

2. Clinical Innovation

- To reduce the number of people in the waiting room, during the pandemic, John Kildea led the effort to implement an SMS-based check-in system for patients in Radiation Oncology at the MUHC. Patients were able to check in from their cars in the parking lot. - Shirin Enger finalized the intensity modulated brachytherapy applicator prototypes for prostate, cervical and rectal cancers.

3. Teaching and Learning

- Launch of the Graduate Diploma in Oncology in September 8 students registered in the inaugural year. Courses conducted by Zoom due to pandemic.
- Department now offers graduate courses with the launch of six ONCO courses:

 - ONCO 630 Oncology Practicum (3 credits)
 - ONCO 635 Qualitative and Psychosocial Health Research (3 credits)
- Work underway to create interdisciplinary Master's and PhD programs.
- Medical and Radiation Oncology Residency Training Programs have been working hard preparing for an Internal Review in 2021. Victoria Mandilaras (Medical Oncology) and Joanne Alfieri (Radiation Oncology) have been working hard to ensure a successful review.
- MORE sessions have been restructured to include mock tumour boards, as suggested by residents and attending physicians.
- Visiting Speakers Program in Oncology Adapting to COVID-19 pandemic
 - January and February speaker tours were in-person. May, July, October, November speaker tours were virtual.
 - Registration via new online portal
