Division Director - Pediatric Infectious Diseases

The **Montreal Children's Hospital, McGill University Health Centre** is seeking a **Division Director** for its Division of Pediatric Infectious Diseases. The individual will lead an experienced and cohesive group, caring for a broad range of patients within the specialty. A clinician-investigator with a track record of research success and productivity will be prioritized. As part of their strategic research plan, McGill University and the Faculty of Medicine have invested in the creation of a McGill Interdisciplinary Institute of Infection and Immunity (MI⁴) that links and supports research expertise and resources across the McGill community. McGill also has a thriving Global Health Program targeting the world-wide burden of infectious diseases. Candidates must have completed a fellowship in pediatric infectious diseases and be board certified or eligible by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Additional training and certification in Microbiology would be of additional value. Due to regulations of the Collège des Médecins du Québec, candidates who completed their medical training outside of North America, France, or Belgium will not be considered. In accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, priority will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents. The MUHC is committed to providing equal employment opportunity to qualified individuals with diverse backgrounds and experiences including aboriginal people, visible minorities, and those with disabilities. The position also comes with an academic appointment at McGill University commensurate with academic qualifications.

About the Division and Montreal Children's Hospital and RI-MUHC

The MCH is a full service academic pediatric hospital that has had international influence in the care of children for over 110 years. In 2015, it relocated to a brand new and very unique facility that is comprised of separate but adjacent pediatric and adult hospitals, a Shriners Hospital, cancer centre, with basic, clinical and translational research facilities on one site. All facilities are adjacent, facilitating collaboration between the pediatric and adult sectors, as well as the clinical and research sectors. Research facilities (basic, clinical and translational) are state of the art and the RI-MUHC has a thriving and well-funded Child Health and Human Development & Infection and Immunity Program. The Division of

Pediatric Infectious Diseases is located within the combined hospital laboratory facilities (including microbiology) with a high volume of inpatient consultation service.
