MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Prologue: As this will be my last Departmental newsletter as Chair & Chief of the Department, I thought it appropriate to take us back to the beginning of my mandate and some personal reflections on the journey since then to this point.

"Start where you are. Use what you have. Do what you can. " - Arthur Ashe

I remember the moment well.

It was Wednesday September 7th 2011, coincidentally my mother's 90th birthday. Interim Dean Samuel Benaroya of the Faculty of Medicine (as it was then known) at McGill had asked that I be available for a phone call at 12:30 to discuss the decision of the Chair-

I awaited the call in my cluttered office at A-514 in the old MCH on Tupper in what had been my professional home since starting on faculty and staff in 1991 surrounded by what can best be described as my collected *tschokes* (staff and trainees of a certain age can easily conjure up the image). As always Sam was prompt. I don't recall a word of what was actually said, but the gist was that after a process lasting 4 years and 2 search committees I had been selected and would be starting on November 1st.

The call ended. There was a brief moment of the elation of personal accomplishment then the dread and weight of expectations and 'imposter' syndrome rapidly set in. My path in academia had been that of a clinician-investigator. I had no educational administrative experience. At the hospital level I had been Division Director of my 'home' Division of Pediatric Neurology for less than 3 years. Nothing in my experience or education truly prepared me for what I was now trusted with managing and more importantly leading. I had asked Sam and there was no playbook to learn from and orient myself with what was expected.

I was on my own.

I did know that I had been preceded by giants and pioneers in pediatrics since the mid-20th Century; Alton Goldbloom, Alan Ross, Mary Ellen Avery, Keith Drummond, Richard Hamilton, Harvey Guyda. I did know that the Department had many skilled and committed members with a passion for child health, education and research. However, it was not yet an organization primed for the 21st century world with an enormous disruptive challenge immediately in its path forward; the once in two generations move of all clinical, educational and research operations to a new site (Glen).

Simultaneously with preparing for the move to take place in 2015, I set to work immediately building with Departmental members what I call the foundation of the organization; mission-vision-values, governance, culture, and budgeting, embracing fundamental principles of inclusion, transparency, objectivity, consensus and accountability. A solid foundation would enable us to counter any operational challenges that would come our way and allow us to build a soaring structure of academic accomplishment.

I deliberately held back on the necessity of a visionary exercise in strategic planning until the move was complete and we had accommodated to our new physical space and could envision, and dare I say dream of, new possibilities previously precluded by physical and technological limitations. And dream we did, with this second strategic portion of my mandate emphasizing clinical and educational innovations, expanding research robustness, and recruitment across the breadth of the Department.

I realized very early in my mandate that the three most important elements of any organization are; Its people. Its people. Its people. These elements are woven into an organizational culture that focuses itself on delivering on its mission. I saw my role as a Chair-Chief to be an enabler unlocking value and a catalyst creating opportunities. To encourage and facilitate great ideas brought forward by remarkable people so that these ideas are realized. To recruit well in a way that was a win on multiple fronts that consistently added new value to the organization as a whole. Leadership was to be a distributive model about empowering individuals in their sector to achieve the best for their people and avoiding micromanagement, but still providing cohesive oversight. I trusted individuals to actualize themselves

It has been a privilege, honour and pleasure leading this Department for the past 10 years. A definite highlight of my own professional and personal journey. Most importantly; Thank <u>you</u> for trusting me as your Chair and Chief these past ten years.

The key question that should be asked of any individual or organization is; Did you leave things better than how you found it? I think there is no doubt that collectively the Department of Pediatrics at McGill and the MCH-MUHC is in a far better place in 2021 than it was in 2011. We can all take pride in this. I know that I do. And \underline{you} should too.

A torch is now passed to the next generation of leaders. I have no doubt that our accomplishments will inspire them to achieve even loftier heights than we have scaled. I look forward to cheering them on as I move to the next part of my life.




DECADE REPORT BY DR. SHEVELL






"The grass can be greener"

Such a new Division would galvanize such a project.

We continue to monitor our accounts on a monthly basis. We are confident our finances will get through the balance of the pandemic without significant impact.



Associate Chair of Research Report

It is time to reflect on the past to prepare for the future...

In the last four years, I was privileged to serve the Department of Pediatrics as its Associate Chair for Research. When I started in this role, I quickly realized that my definition of research is very broad. It encompasses the initial case series published by sharp-eyed clinicians, the observational studies that aim to identify risk factors and predict outcomes, the biomedical research that help us to understand disease mechanisms and discover molecular therapies, and the randomized controlled trials that test new medical interventions. Add to this mix research in the fields of medical education, population health, health services, and quality improvement, and you will hopefully understand my viewpoint. However, despite their diverse methodologies, all these different types of research share a common goal: to improve the health of our children.

This shared goal is the reason behind my belief in multidisciplinary research. I truly believe that clinicians, clinical researchers, basic scientists, and patients must work together to ensure that the studies we do are meaningful and useful. Thus, it is crucial to break silos between these groups and help them to produce the best research they can. This vision has been my driving force over the last four years.

One of my first acts as Associate Chair for Research was the creation of the Department of Pediatrics Research Working Group in 2018. This group works to integrate research to our departmental activities and to develop infrastructure to ensure the thriving of pediatric research at our Department. Its members include representatives from Clinician scientists (Patricia Li), PhD/basic researchers (Kolja Eppert), Clinicians (Emmett Francoeur), the Coordinator of the Resident Research Program (Pia Wintermark), and the Director of Child Health Research at the RI-MUHC (current: Indra Gupta; past Aimee Ryan).

The collaborative work between the Research Working Group and our department members was fundamental to understand our needs and the actions that we needed to take to help our department to reach its research potential. This is for sure a work in progress, but we are heading in the right direction.

Among the initiatives that we have implemented, I would like to highlight the following:

- 1. Environmental scan of departmental research needs: in 2018, the Department of Pediatrics organized a Renewal Day to discuss the departmental members' needs regarding research. This exercise included clinicians and clinician-scientists. We have also interviewed Residency Program Directors and held meetings with our departmental PhD researchers to assess their needs.
- 2. <u>Pilot study competition:</u> created in 2019, this competition aims to allow researchers from the Department of Pediatrics to obtain preliminary data that will increase their success when applying for grants from peer-review external granting agencies or from industry. The competition offers two operating grants of \$20,000/each for pilot projects in the areas of clinical and basic research, medical education, and/or quality improvement.

- 3. <u>Orientation day for new departmental researchers:</u> the Research "Crash" Course is an activity jointly supported by the Department of Pediatrics and the RI- MUHC since 2018. It aims to provide orientation for newly hired departmental researchers to facilitate the beginning of their academic careers at McGill.
- **4. Epidemiology consults:** the aim of this initiative, which was started in January 2019, is to increase the methodological quality of our residents' scholarly projects, and, consequently, the research performed by our different divisions. This is an expansion of a similar program created by Dr. Pia Wintermark for the General Pediatrics residents. Residents and fellows from the Department of Pediatrics (General Pediatrics and Pediatric sub-specialties) have access to 4 hours/academic year of Epidemiology consultation paid by the Department of Pediatrics.
- **5. Fostering divisional research infra-structure:** this program, created in 2019, offers annual funds (\$5,000 per year/division; maximum of 7 divisions eligible to receive funds per year) for the development of divisional research infrastructure. As a rule, all division research related activities funded by this program must benefit all division members involved in research (i.e., clinicians, clinician scientists, PhD researchers, residents, and fellows).

This past year has been very challenging for all of us. Due to the pandemic, we had to unfortunately put on hold some of our departmental research initiatives. However, the plan is to resume them in 2021.

I must also highlight the highly successful team of researchers that we have in our department. Our clinician-scientists and PhD researchers have been extremely successful in advancing pediatric research and imprinting the Montreal Children's Hospital stamp in different fields. The high quality of their work is the reason behind our departmental success in grant and salary award competitions. Thus, I would like to take this final opportunity to thank them for all their work, commitment, and resilience.

In addition, I would like to thank the members of the Research Working Group for their engagement and thoughtful advice; Aimee Ryan and Indra Gupta for being my "partners in crime" at the RI-MUHC level; Melissa Acciaioli and Sylvia Markhauser for their administrative support; and Penny Moutsos (RI-MUHC) for her administrative help and endless kindness. I also want to thank our Chair Dr. Michael Shevell for sharing my vision of pediatric research excellence for our department and his unconditional support to all research initiatives we have implemented.

Finally, I wish the new Associate Chair of Research a wonderful mandate during which I am confident we will move further in our goal of excelling in research. May this new person succeed in bringing together all members of our department that share the common goal of doing meaningful research... because research, at least according to my broad definition, is the first step to improve the health of our children.

Congratulations to our department and its members who continue to advance our educational mission. A few highlights of some of the recent health professions educational initiatives include:

- Departmental Alumni Program We are in the process of creating a program to maintain connections with pediatric residents and fellows who have graduated from our core and subspecialty programs. Stay tuned for more details.
- 2. Institute of Pediatric Simulation (IPS) The Institute for Pediatric Simulation continues to support and implement excellent simulations under the leadership of Dr. Ilana Bank and the IPS Committee. The Virtual Resuscitation Room (VRR) is a new initiative which enables trainees to participate in simulation in a virtual resuscitation room. This innovation was successfully piloted by Pediatric Emergency Medicine staff and subspecialty residents who provided pediatric emergency training to residents in the 5-year Emergency Medicine program. This VRR will be used for the Pediatric R1 bootcamp this summer. IPS simulation activities have restarted since May 2021 now that covid restrictions have been lifted. If anyone would like to carry out simulation activities in the Fall, please contact ilana.bank@mcgill.ca.
- 3. CPD In the winter of 2021, we hosted our first virtual Practical Problems of Pediatrics course which was very successful. Thank you to course coordinators Drs. Holly Agostino, Sara Long-Gagne, John Yaremko and Barry Slapcoff for their creativity and commitment to this activity. In addition, under Dr. Terry Sigman's leadership, we are in the midst of updating and enhancing our CPD webpage which will include upcoming conferences, uploaded videos of Grand Rounds 2020-2021, access to our Evidence-based Pediatric Rounds by zoom and a new toolbox of resources for pediatricians and family doctors. The update should be completed by the end of the summer and we will notify all department members by email. If you would like to advertise an upcoming conference or regular rounds or have tools or divisional round recordings that you would like to share with our pediatricians and community partners, please send the information to Peds.CPD@muhc.mcgill.ca.
- 4. CanMEDS Rounds for subspecialty residents and fellows continued to be successful in a virtual format and are being scheduled for the 2021-2022 year. Thank you to Drs. Anne-Marie Canakis and Lianne Kopel, in collaboration with subspecialty Program Directors and with the support of Sally Crawford for their ongoing commitment to this initiative.
- 5. Subspecialty Orientation Bootcamp, coordinated by Drs. Najma Ahmed and Tiscar Cavalle, has continued to successfully support and onboard new pediatric subspecialty trainees. The next bootcamp will take place virtually on June 28th 8:00-12:00.
- 6. Competence by Design (CBD) CBD will be implemented for the Core General Pediatrics in July, 2021. Rotation coordinators have been modifying the rotation ITERs to align with the first CBD cohort of Entrustable Professional Activities (EPAs). Dr. Robert Sternszus, Dr. Elisa Ruano-Cea and the CBD Steering Committee members (Drs. Ariel Chackowicz, Evelyn Constantin, Mylène Dandavino, David D'Arienzo, Rosie Dion, June Ortenberg, Laurie Plotnick, Jill Ranger, Cassandra Tetu, David Zielinski, and Alessandra Tedeschi) continue to provide support to ensure a smooth implementation.
- Successful accreditation reviews 2020-2021 Congratulations to the following programs which received full accreditation this year: Developmental Pediatrics (Program Director: Dr. Emmett Francoeur), Pediatric Emergency Medicine (Program Director: Dr. Raphael Paquin) and Pediatric Rheumatology (Program Director: Dr. Sarah Campillo)
- 8. Pediatric Point of Care Ultrasound (POCUS) Workshop This inaugural, multi-disciplinary, high-level Pediatric Point-of-care Ultrasound (POCUS) course led by Dr. Jade Seguin, was the result of a collaboration of POCUS champions from various divisions/departments including Pediatric Emergency Medicine, Pediatric Critical Care, Neonatology, Anesthesia and Trauma.
- 9. Helen Karounis Agora Program (H-KAP) We now have twelve H-KAP Fellows who have volunteered over 600 hours of their time to academic activities within the Department of Pediatrics and Faculty of Medicine and Health. In 2016, we were recovering to our **relocation to the Glen**, trying to find ways to provide safe care while still getting lost going to meetings rooms. Then, there was the near-miss of the 2018 **Saudi crisis** and the decreasing resident numbers which let to the reorganization of the clinical coverage of many units and efforts to bring in Membres-Associes to help support our mission. And last year, a **pandemic** turned everything upside down, bringing adult patients to our ED, PICU and medico-surgical wards, and sending us to support our struggling adult partner centres.

Most clinical area across our institution now use **OACIS** for ordering and documentation, and the next few years may bring us a well-needed interconnectedness between key parts of our health care network, and a province-wide EMR

Our solid **Patient Flow** infrastructure was recently joined by a **Patient Safety & Quality** structure, which will allow for many more silo-busting, data-driven, quality focused collaborative projects to launch. Perhaps soon the vision of all key clinical managers and directors will come together to set and catalyze the strategic orientations of our institution so that we may define even further our place in the care of the children of Quebec, and define what makes us truly unique.





Thanks to our efforts, and despite the various challenges we faced, our Department's clinical mission has been operating with a never-seen before efficiency, using real-time data gathering and monitoring systems, agile medical scheduling approaches, new data-informed transversal patient trajectory protocols, and innovative outpatient care programs. The long-awaited new PEM rules will allow for end of career transitions and bring recruits to provide breathing room and safer clinical coverage to programs and Divisions. It is because we value each other's roles and work together that our patients are cared for

people, in the right place, at the right time.
