Workshop Goals

By the end of this workshop, participants will be able to: understand the relevance, structure and organization of the accreditation process, including documentation and preparation for a simulated survey team visit; demonstrate knowledge of the general standards of accreditation and to apply them to their specialty; describe the new Can MEDS 2015 competencies; discuss how each intrinsic role will be assessed within their specialty; recognize 'red flags' or other signs of a struggling resident; outline problems that are knowledge-based, skills oriented (including clinical reasoning) or attitudinal; differentiate problems that are learner, teacher or system-centered; list the key steps involved in data-gathering for a struggling resident; and describe common lapses in clinical reasoning abilities and how one can identify them in the clinical context.
