

Colorectal Surgery Residency Program

The McGill University Department of Surgery, Section of Colon & Rectal Surgery is offering a two-year Royal College accredited residency training program in Colon & Rectal surgery, beginning July 1 day, 2016. The two years of the residency program includes one year of clinical training and one year of research to satisfy the Royal College eligibility for certification.

The McGill University Section of Colon & Rectal Surgery offers a high-volume exposure to benign and malignant colorectal diseases. There is an emphasis on Colorectal Cancer, Inflammatory Bowel disease, and anorectal disease. Procedures include Transanal Endoscopic Microsurgery (TEM), anorectal physiology testing and surgical procedures, colonoscopy and advanced Minimally Invasive Surgery. The training will occur at two sites, the McGill University Health Centre and the Jewish General Hospital.

Candidates should be graduates of an accredited General Surgery program with Royal College certification, or must be eligible to be doing the exams prior to starting the residency program. In addition applicants should be eligible for licensing as a resident with the College des Medecins du Quebec.
