Gastroenterology

The Department of Medicine Residency Training Program in Adult Gastroenterology provides a two-year integrated training program at the MUHC (Montreal General, Royal Victoria), and the Sir M. B. Davis - Jewish General Hospitals.

Three years in internal medicine are required to enter the Adult Gastroenterology Training Program. The program includes both continuing care and consultative service, and active participation in the investigation, follow-up and management of hospitalized and ambulatory patients with gastrointestinal and hepatic disorders. Trainees are supervised by members of the Faculty and, depending on their performance, they assume a progressive responsibility. All endoscopic units are equipped with videoendoscopy so that a trainee and his/her supervisor can observe simultaneously. Trainees will acquire an expertise in endoscopy of the upper and lower gastrointestinal tracts including colonoscopic polypectomy. They will also be exposed to therapeutic endoscopy and endoscopic retrograde cannulation of the biliary and pancreatic ducts. Trainees are expected to familiarize themselves with the principles, performance and interpretation of a variety of laboratory function tests (esophageal motility, ambulatory pH monitoring, tests of intestinal secretion and absorption) and biopsy procedures. A scientific approach and research interest is fostered. Trainees are encouraged to undertake a research project, although this is not compulsory. Rotation periods in diagnostic radiology, endoscopic retrograde cholangio pancreatography, gastrointestinal pathology and nutrition are provided. In addition, a 3-month rotation is devoted to general hepatology and liver transplantation.
