590A Seminar: Special Topics in Philosophy Psychoanalysis: A Critical Examination

(3 credits. Prerequisite: one course in philosophy)

Instructor: Professor K. Arvanitakis

The particular direction that the seminar will take will depend on the composition and interests of the class. Areas examined could include: psychoanalytic epistemology, psychoanalysis and the pre-socratics, psychoanalysis and tragedy, psychoanalytic aesthetics, psychoanalytic ethics, causes versus reasons in psychoanalysis, psychoanalytic hermeneutics, self-deception, irrationality, paradox, creativity, the internal object world and its relation to external objects.

Method of assessment: Class participation: 30%

Term paper: 70%
