In this task you will...

STEP 1: Look at a picture and answer questions

STEP 2: Record and post an audio/video based on Step 1

STEP 3: Listen AND respond to your classmates' posts





STEP 1: Meeting People

Choose one person in the picture and answer:

- O Where is the person from?
- O What is the person's nationality?
- O What greeting does the person use?
- What greetings do you know in languages other than English?

Record a short 1 to 2 minute **audio** response

STEP 2: Introducing Yourself

Like the people in Step 1, introduce yourself and:

- Include a greeting
 - Example: *Hello!* or *Hi!*
- Say your name
- Say the city where you live
- Say your nationality
- Include a closing
 - Example: Bye! or Pleased to meet you

Note: Feel free to use words in languages other than English


STEP 1: WH-Questions

Note: If you can't say everything in English, no problem. Use your repertoire: gestures, languages, signs, etc.

STEP 2: Mini-Interviews

Now it's your turn to ask the questions! Ask your teachers and your classmates about:

- The languages they use
- Their birthday and zodiac sign
- Their favourite holiday
- Their favourite artist/singer/poet/rapper
- A food that is typical in their family or in their culture
- Their reasons for learning English

In this activity, you have practiced:

- Oral production (B1): Can sustain a straightforward monologue on a familiar topic or a topic of you interest, presenting it as a linear sequence of points.
- Online interaction (B1): Can comment on other people's online posts, provided they are spoken in simple language
- Building on plurilingual repertoire (A1): Can mobilize your repertoire in different languages and semiotic resources in order to explain a point
- Building on pluricultural repertoire (A2): Can recognize and appropriately use cultural knowledge like talking about online and in-person learning environments

STEP 1: I Spy with my Little Eye...

Using <u>There is</u> or <u>there are</u>, name FIVE things that you see in the picture.

Example: There are trophies. (Can you see/find them?)

Record a short 1 to 2 minute **audio** response



In this task you will...

STEP 1: Watch a short video and answer questions

STEP 2: Record and post an audio/video based on Step 1

STEP 3: Listen AND respond to your classmates' posts





STEP 1: Daily Routines

Watch the short video about someone's **daily routine**. Then answer:

- O What time does she wake up in the morning?
- O What does she do after yoga?
- What does she usually eat for breakfast
- O What about for lunch?
- Owhere does she go after work?
- O What language is the book she is reading?
- What time does she sleep every night?

Record a short 1 to 2 minute audio response





Tip: Practice using **complete sentences** in your answers. For example: She works from 9:30am to 3:30pm.

STEP 2: Your Daily Routine

It's your turn to tell us about your daily routine! Share:

- What time do you normally wake up?
- What do you <u>usually</u> do after you wake up?
- O Do you work or study everyday?
- Do you watch movies and TV series, or read books in your free time?
- Do you watch movies, TV shows, read books in different languages?
- O What time you typically to bed?
