There have been several recent phishing attempts using what appears to be an email coming from a personal @gmail account from members of the department, including messages such as, "Hello are you available? Please I need your assistance urgently." Although the account may show a name you know, it is often fake. This type of scam is a common problem. When in doubt, DO NOT REPLY to the message and DO NOT CLICK on any links. Delete the email immediately. You should, instead, send an email to the person's official McGill email to verify its
